In our capacity as Statutory Auditor of BNP Paribas Home Loan SFH and in compliance with your request within the framework of the preparation of the base prospectus submitted to the approval of the French financial markets authority *(Autorité des Marches Financiers)* and relating to the update of the Covered Bond program, we have audited the accompanying cash flow statement of BNP Paribas Home Loan SFH for the year ended December 31, 2020 (the "cash flow statement").
