Aéroports de Paris successfully places €500 million international bond issue

Aéroports de Paris successfully placed a bond issue with the following characteristics:

- Issue amount: €500 million
- Coupon: 6.375%
- Maturity date: 24 January 2014

BNP Paribas and Natixis are the lead managers.

The proceeds from the bond issue will be used to finance Group investments and to finance the souscription to the reserved capital increase of N.V. Luchthaven Schiphol.

Aéroports de Paris has registered this prospectus with the Autorité des Marchés Financiers under AMF visa number 08-256 on 19 November 2008. This document has been compiled by the issuer and engages the responsibility of its signatories. It comprises:
