Aéroports de Paris November 2008 traffic figures

Passenger traffic

In November 2008, passenger traffic at Aéroports de Paris decreased by 4.8% compared with November 2007. Paris airports handled 6.2 million passengers divided up between 4.3 million at Paris-Charles de Gaulle (-3.7%) and 1.9 million at Paris-Orly (-7.1%). The November traffic results were affected by a four-day industrial dispute in the air transport industry causing approximately an estimated 2.2 percentage points decrease. For the record, the 2007 November traffic figures had shown a buoyant 5.3 % growth.

Over the first eleven months of this year, passenger traffic recorded a 1.1% growth.

Traffic figures for November 2008 were marked by a stable international market (-0.1%). The African market grew robustly by 6.5% while traffic on American as well as Asian and Middle Eastern routes decreased by 3.8% and 2.5%, respectively.

Domestic traffic stood at -11.6%. European traffic decreased by 5.4% with -6.2% on Schengen routes and -8.1% for the British and Irish markets.

Aircraft movements

The number of aircraft movements stood at -6.1% in November 2008 year on year (-5.3% at Paris-Charles de Gaulle and -7.9% at Paris-Orly). The passenger load factor reached 70.96% in November 2008 compared with 69.72% in November 2007.
