# Aéroports de Paris January 2009 traffic figures

## Passenger traffic

In January 2009, passenger traffic at Aéroports de Paris decreased by 7.8% compared with January 2008. Paris airports handled 5.9 million passengers divided up between 4.1 million for Paris-Charles de Gaulle (-6.5%) and 1.8 million (-10.7%) for Paris-Orly.

The adverse weather conditions at the beginning of the year, the national strike on January 29<sup>th</sup> and the global economic environment led to the decrease in passenger traffic.

Traffic figures for January 2009 were marked by a 4% decrease in international traffic. The African market remained dynamic with a 1.8% growth. However, traffic on North and Latin American routes decreased by 6.4% and 5.5%, respectively. Traffic also decreased by 8.4% on Asian routes and by 4.7% on Middle Eastern routes.

In January 2009, domestic traffic stood at -12.4%. European traffic decreased by 9.5% of which 11.1% on Schengen routes and 7.3% for the British and Irish markets.

#### Aircraft movements

The number of aircraft movements stood at -8.3% in January 2009 year on year (-6.8% at Paris-Charles de Gaulle and -11.8% at Paris-Orly). The passenger load factor reached 66.9% in January 2009 compared with 66.96% in January 2008.
