# Aéroports de Paris February 2009 traffic figures

## Passenger traffic

In February 2009, passenger traffic at Aéroports de Paris decreased by 8.1% compared to February 2008. Paris airports handled a total of 5.6 million passengers divided up between 3.8 million for Paris-Charles de Gaulle (-8.8%) and 1.7 million for Paris-Orly (-6.3%).

The current economic context, as well as the effects of February having one day less than last year (28 days in 2009 compared to 29 days in 2008) explain this change.

- International traffic decreased by 5%. Traffic on routes to and from Africa was dynamic, growing by 2.5%. By contrast, on North and Latin America routes, traffic decreased by 8.5% and 9.8% respectively, while Asia dropped by 9.2% and the Middle East by 5.3%.
- Domestic traffic stood at -6.3%.

• European traffic decreased overall by 11.2% of which 11.5% on Schengen routes and 13.2% for the British and Irish markets.

#### Aircraft movements

The number of aircraft movements stood at -7% in February 2009 year on year (-7.8% at Paris-Charles de Gaulle and -4.7% at Paris-Orly). The passenger load factor reached 67.6% compared with 68.5% in February 2008.
