## Paris-Charles de Gaulle becomes the 5<sup>th</sup> busiest airport in the world

35 years after handling its first passenger, Paris-Charles de Gaulle airport is ranked 5<sup>th</sup> busiest airport in the world, according to the 2008 preliminary airport ranking by Airports Council international (ACI).

For the second consecutive year, Paris-Charles de Gaulle airport wins a position in the global ranking of airports. In 2008, it was ahead of Los Angeles airport.

Paris-Charles de Gaulle handled nearly 61 million passengers in 2008, an increase of 1.6% year on year. A total of 950 million passengers have travelled through Paris-Charles de Gaulle since its opening in March 1974. Paris-Charles de Gaulle has become the most dynamic economic area of the Ile-de France region in terms of job creation with 90 000 direct jobs on the airport site. Between 1995 and 2007, 10 jobs a day on average were created on site.

These good results are due to the numerous competitive assets of Paris-Charles de Gaulle:

- Its exceptional geographical location next to Paris and at the heart of the 2<sup>nd</sup> catchment area in Europe, with 25 million inhabitants at less than 200 kilometers from the airport.
- Paris-Charles de Gaulle accommodates the most powerful hub in Europe, the Air France-KLM hub, with 24 000 possible connections in less than 2 hours\*.
- Thanks to its recent investments in the terminals at Paris-Charles de Gaulle Airport (La Galerie Parisienne, Terminal 2<sup>E</sup> boarding pier), Aéroports de Paris has increased its capacities by more than 21 million passengers in 2 years as well as the quality of services offered to passengers.

The 2008 ranking by ACI coincides with the total reopening of the central area in Terminal 1 unveiled exactly 35 years ago. After a 5 year overhaul, the "historical" terminal of Paris-Charles can now handle 10.8 million passengers per year.
