Passenger traffic

In March 2009, passenger traffic at Aéroports de Paris decreased by 9.8% compared to March 2008. Paris airports handled a total of 6.5 million passengers divided up between 4.5 million for Paris-Charles de Gaulle (-9.1%) and 2.0 million for Paris-Orly (-11.2%).

• International traffic decreased by 6.3%. Traffic on routes to and from Africa was stable at -0.5%. However, on North and Latin America routes, traffic decreased by 11.2% and 7.3% respectively, while Asia dropped by 7.7% and the Middle East by 7.2%.

• Domestic traffic stood at -7.2% with notably the impact on domestic flights of the nationwide strike on March 19th and the strong rail competition, particularly on the route from Paris to Strasbourg.

• European traffic, fell by 12.9% including 13.7% on Schengen routes and 11.3% for the British and Irish markets.

The number of aircraft movements stood at -1.8% in March 2009 year on year (-0.6% at Paris-Charles de Gaulle and -4.5% at Paris-Orly). The passenger load factor reached 69.2% compared with 74.0% in March 2008.
