## /// ID Logistics: revenues for 3<sup>rd</sup>quarter 2012

# Business remains very buoyant Year-to-date revenues up 23.9%

Cavaillon (France), 24 October 2012 – The ID Logistics Group's consolidated revenues for the first nine months of 2012 amounted to €410.2 million, up 23.9%. Revenues for the third quarter alone rose by 19.4%.

#### **Business momentum driven by emerging markets**

ID Logistics generated revenues of €142.2 million in the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter of 2012, up 19.4% compared with the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter of 2011. At like-for-like exchange rates and consolidation perimeter, revenues increased by 14.5%.

Group year-to-date revenues for the nine months ended 30 September 2012 totalled €410.2 million, up 23.9% on the same period last year. At like-for-like exchange rates and consolidation perimeter, business volumes for the first nine months were up 18.7%.

The Group's strong business momentum is due to the "pure player" contract logistics strategy it has been implementing for a number of years and to its strong presence in emerging countries.



- <u>France</u> Despite the adverse economic environment, the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter remained on target, with likefor-like growth of 11.2% (excluding the takeover of Mory and the closure of the pallet distribution and fruit and vegetables pooling businesses). Revenues increased sharply over the first nine months of the year to finish at €250.8 million, up 18% at current perimeter and 15.8% like-for-like (excluding the takeover of Mory and the closure of the pallet distribution and fruit and vegetables pooling businesses).
- <u>International</u> ID Logistics is reaping the benefits of its position on booming emerging markets (including Brazil, China and Poland). The Group continues to outperform the markets in which it operates thanks to market share gains. Revenues for the first nine months amounted to €159.4 million, up 34.6%, and up 35.5% at comparable exchange rates.

#### Strong business outlook

"The ID Logistics Group is actively continuing its expansion in France and abroad. Business is growing steadily due to the extension of existing customer partnerships and the gain of new customers" said Éric Hémar, ID Logistics Group chairman and CEO. "We are on course towards achieving our double-digit growth target for 2012 and will continue our growth momentum in 2013".
