Jean-Paul Bailly to Advise PSA Peugeot Citroën on the Project for the Future of the Aulnay-sous-Bois Plant

Jean-Paul Bailly has been appointed as a special advisor to the Chairman of the PSA Peugeot Citroën Managing Board to support the Group in leading the project for the future of its plant in Aulnay-sous-Bois.

He is a member of France's Economic, Social and Environmental Council (CESE) and sits on the Boards of Directors of Accor and Edenred. He is also President of the IMS – Entreprendre pour la Cité association.
