## €3,000,000,000 Global Medium Term Note Programme

Under this 3,000,000,000 Global Medium Term Note Programme (the "**Programme**"), Thales (the "**Issuer**") may from time to time issue notes (the "**Notes**") denominated in any currency agreed between itself and the relevant Dealer(s) (as defined below) subject to compliance with all applicable legal and/or regulatory and/or central bank requirements.

Notes may be issued on a continuing basis to one or more of the Dealers specified in "General Description of the Programme" herein and any additional Dealers appointed under the Programme from time to time, which appointment may be for a specific issue or on an ongoing basis (each a "**Dealer**" and together, the "**Dealers**").

Application has been made to the *Autorité des marchés financiers* (the "**AMF**") for approval of this Base Prospectus in its capacity as competent authority under the prospectus directive (Directive 2003/71/EC) as amended by Directive 2010/73/EU (the "**Prospectus Directive**"). This Base Prospectus received the visa no. 13-579 on 29 October 2013 from the AMF. Application may be made (i) to Euronext Paris during the period of 12 months from the date of the approval of this Base Prospectus for Notes issued under the Programme to be admitted to trading and/or (ii) to the listing authority of any other European Economic Area Member State for Notes issued under the Programme to be admitted to trading on a Regulated Market (as defined below) in such Member State. Euronext Paris is a regulated market for the purposes of the Markets in Financial Instruments Directive 2004/39/EC (a "**Regulated Market**"). References in this document to Euronext Paris ("**Euronext Paris**") and all related references shall include the Regulated Market. The Programme also permits Notes to be issued on the basis that they will not be admitted to listing, trading and/or quotation by any listing authority, stock exchange and/or quotation system or to be admitted to listing, trading and/or quotation by such other or further listing authorities, stock exchanges and/or quotation systems as may be agreed with the Issuer.

In the case of any Notes which are to be listed and admitted to trading on a Regulated Market within the European Economic Area or offered to the public in a Member State of the European Economic Area in circumstances which require the publication of a prospectus under the Prospectus Directive (as defined above), the minimum denomination shall be  $\leq 100,000$  (or its equivalent in any other currency as at the date of issue of the relevant Notes) or more.

See the "Risk Factors" section for a description of certain factors which should be considered by potential investors in connection with any investment in the Notes.

Unless otherwise specified in the applicable Final Terms, Notes to be issued under the Programme with a maturity of 12 months or more will be rated BBB+ (positive outlook) by Standard & Poor's Credit Market Services Europe Limited, a division of the McGraw Hill Companies Inc. ("Standard & Poor's") and A2 (negative outlook) by Moody's Investors Service Limited ("Moody's") and Notes to be issued under the Programme with a maturity of less than 12 months will be rated A-2 by Standard & Poor's and P-1 by Moody's. Tranches of Notes issued under the Programme may be rated or unrated. Each of Moody's and Standard & Poor's is a credit rating agency established in the European Union and registered under Regulation (EU) No 1060/2009, as amended (the "CRA Regulation"). As such each of Moody's and Standard & Poor's is included in the list of credit rating agencies published by the European Securities and Markets Authority on its website in accordance with such regulation and they appear on the latest update of the list of registered credit rating agencies (as of 3 June 2013) on the ESMA website http://www.esma.europa.eu. The rating of the Notes (if any) will be specified in the relevant Final Terms. Whether or not a rating in relation to any Notes will be treated as having been issued by a credit rating agency established in the European Union and registered under the CRA Regulation will be disclosed in the relevant Final Terms. Where a Tranche of Notes is rated, such rating will not necessarily be the same as the rating assigned to the Programme. A credit rating is not a recommendation to buy, sell or hold Notes and may be subject to revision, suspension or withdrawal at any time by the relevant rating organisation.

This Base Prospectus should be read and construed together with any supplements hereto and with any other documents incorporated by reference herein and, in relation to any Tranche (as defined herein) of Notes, should be read and construed together with the relevant Final Terms (as defined herein). This Base Prospectus supersedes the base prospectus dated 24 October 2012 issued in respect of the Programme.

## **RISK FACTORS**

The Issuer believes that the following factors may affect its ability to fulfil its obligations under Notes issued under the Programme. All of these factors are contingencies which may or may not occur and the Issuer is not in a position to express a view on the likelihood of any such contingency occurring.

Factors which the Issuer believes may be material for the purpose of assessing the market risks associated with Notes issued under the Programme are also described below.

The Issuer believes that the factors described below represent the principal risks inherent in investing in Notes issued under the Programme. Prospective investors should, however read the detailed information set out elsewhere in this Base Prospectus (including any documents incorporated by reference herein) and reach their own views prior to making any investment decision.

#### **RISK FACTORS RELATING TO THE ISSUER**

Thales is exposed to a number of risks and uncertainties which could materially affect its business, reputation, financial position, results or ability to achieve its objectives. The risks described below are not the only ones that Thales faces. Other risks, unknown to Thales on this date, or which presently appear to be non-significant, could also have an unfavourable impact on the business, profitability and financial position of the Group or its ability to achieve its objectives.

Generally, Thales may be faced with a number of financial, legal, operational and strategic risks.

## 1. FINANCIAL RISKS

## 1.1 LIQUIDITY

Thales' liquidity risk corresponds to its level of exposure to changes in the main market indicators that could lead to an increase in the cost of credit or even to a temporary limitation of access to external sources of financing.

The Group manages this risk by trying to anticipate its cash needs and ensures that these are covered by the Group's short-term and long-term financial resources as follows:

- shareholders' equity, listed by heading in Note 20 to the consolidated financial statements;
- gross debt, listed by maturity in Note 24 to the consolidated financial statements;
- committed, undrawn credit facilities granted by banks as backup for the commercial paper programme and acting as a financing reserve. These are described in more detail in Note 24 to the consolidated financial statements.

The principle of centralising the entities' short-term assets and liabilities (cash pooling) is applied to the combination of entities in the same currency zone – euro zone, sterling zone, dollar zone and Australian dollar zone, etc. – and, in some cases, in the same country.

Through the consolidation and centralisation of cash requirements and surpluses of its units, the Group is in a position to:

- Simplify cash management and match the cash positions of units to produce a single consolidated position that is easier to manage;
- Gain prime access to financial markets through the parent company's financing programmes, rated by Standard & Poor's and Moody's (see below).

At 31 December 2012, cash recorded under consolidated assets amounted to 2,518.3m (compared with 1,923.1m at end-2011), including:

- €1,721.8m held by the parent company and available for immediate use;
- €392.8m in the bank credit balances of subsidiaries, most of them outside France. This figure includes, inter alia, payments received in the last few days of the financial year and subsequently transferred to the corporate treasury account;

• €403.7m in cash held directly by the companies in joint ventures (prorated by Thales' interest in each joint venture), including €191.3m for DCNS, for which Group cash pooling cannot be used.

Cash at bank and equivalents at year-end is solely invested in bank deposits, in very short-term bank certificates of deposit with first-tier banks or in money market funds. At the date of publication, Thales' credit risk ratings were as follows:

The decrease of Thales' credit risk rating does not trigger covenants included in financing contracts. The entry into force of the only clause providing for accelerated repayment would only apply in the event that the State no longer held its golden share and, simultaneously, the ratio of consolidated net financial debt to EBITDA (earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation and amortisation) were to exceed 3.

A lower rating would result in an increase (capped) in the margins applicable to the committed credit facility of I.5bn (described in Note 24 to the consolidated financial statements); at the same time, these margins would be improved (with a minimum threshold) in the event of a rating upgrade.

## **1.2 INTEREST RATES**

Thales is exposed to interest rate volatility and in particular its impact on the conditions associated with Thales is exposed to interest rate volatility and in particular its impact on the conditions associated with variable-rate borrowings. To limit this risk, Thales operates an active policy of interest rate hedging.

The Corporate Financing and Treasury Department consolidates data on Thales' exposure to interest rate risk and uses the appropriate financial instruments to hedge those risks.

Thales' policy is to control interest rate and counterparty risks and to optimise its funding and banking operations.

The breakdown of Thales' debt by type of interest rate is described in Note 24 to the consolidated financial statements. The table below summarises the Group's exposure to interest rate risk before and after hedging.

## **1.3 FOREIGN EXCHANGE**

Due to the international nature of its business, Thales is exposed to the risk of exchange rate fluctuations.

## **1.3.1. BUSINESS-RELATED CURRENCY RISK**

Business-related currency risk occurs when some of the business is billed in a currency other than that of the related costs.

(a) As a general rule, Thales is structurally immune to exchange rate fluctuations for a significant part of its business activity. Almost half of Thales' sales are generated in the euro zone, which is also where most of its industrial operations are located. In addition, Thales' international development policy, both in Europe and in other parts of the world (the United States, Australia, South Korea, etc.) allows the company to manufacture and invoice in local currency, thereby eliminating exchange rate risk on local sales.

(b) The accounts of Thales subsidiaries located in countries where the official currency is not the euro are translated into euros in the Group's consolidated financial statements. A fall in these currencies against the euro is likely to have a negative impact on the accounts. Its impact on profitability is limited, however, since the cost base of these subsidiaries is essentially in the same currency as their sales.

(c) For certain businesses of the Group (civil avionics and tubes, civil space, etc.), the US dollar ("**USD**") is the reference transaction currency. For business activities outside the dollar zone (the in-flight entertainment business is based essentially in the United States and is therefore largely immune to this risk), a specific currency risk hedging policy is implemented.

- For equipment transactions (avionics and tubes), this policy is defined on the basis of sales forecasts in USD, after accounting for corresponding purchases in USD. For these transactions, net exposure to dollar risk represents around 3% of the Group's total sales for 2012.
- For longer-term programmes in markets traditionally denominated in USD (primarily in civil space and simulators), each bid is examined for profitability in the light of the effect of currency fluctuations, after accounting for corresponding purchases in USD, and, if necessary, is specifically hedged through market transactions (forward exchange-rate contracts and options).

Where necessary, a similar approach is adopted for other Thales activities if a customer specifically requires a contract denominated in USD.

Overall, net exposure represented around 4% of the Group's total sales for 2012.

• As well as this direct dollar risk, which concerned around 7% in total of consolidated sales at end-2012, Thales is also exposed to an "indirect" dollar risk on contracts denominated in currencies other than the dollar. This occurs when it is bidding against companies that benefit from a cost base in dollars. Analysis by product line and region shows that approximately 20% of total sales may be exposed to this "indirect" dollar risk.

The "dollar risk" is thus the main currency risk that Thales needs to hedge. The figures corresponding to the hedging of business-related dollar risk are as follows:

- USD 3,102m, the amount of the financial instruments hedging net firm commitments (USD risk against EUR, CAD and GBP) at 31 December 2012, compared with USD 3,563m at 31 December 2011;
- USD 238m, the amount of the financial instruments hedging USD bids against EUR, CAD and GBP at 31 December 2012 versus USD 201m at 31 December 2011.

Operating receivables and payables denominated in foreign currency are exchange-rate hedged and therefore not exposed to currency risk.

The change in value of financial instruments (forward transactions) used as cash flow hedges is recognised in shareholders' equity. A decrease (increase) of 5% in the USD against the EUR, GBP and CAD would have increased (decreased) shareholders' equity by approximately €18m at 31 December 2012 compared with €139m at 31 December 2011. The discount/premium component is not eligible to cash flow hedge accounting

and is recognised through profit and loss. In 2012, the change in market value of the discount/premium was - €14m.

The change in value of financial instruments matched with portfolios of sales offers which are not eligible for hedge accounting is recognised in profit and loss. A decrease (increase) of 5% in the USD against the EUR, GBP and CAD would have increased (decreased) the result by approximately €5m at 31 December 2012 versus €2m at 31 December 2011.

Foreign currency-denominated financial debt does not generate any exposure in profit and loss, as it is either denominated in the functional currency of the entity in which it is recognised, or is used as a net foreign investment hedge.

## 1.3.2. MANAGEMENT OF RISKS RELATING TO FOREIGN CURRENCY-DENOMINATED ASSETS

Thales hedges a very limited part of its foreign currency-denominated assets, mainly those likely to be disposed of at a future date. The main criteria for determining whether or not a given foreign currency-denominated asset should be hedged are as follows:

- the nature of the business involved;
- the structure of Thales' commitment with respect to jointly-held companies, in particular the specific features of the shareholders' agreement in each joint venture.

In general, hedging is achieved by loans or currency swaps in the same currency as the assets to be hedged. The actual application of this policy also depends on:

- the objective of optimising hedges in the light of market conditions (availability of foreign currency, interest rates, hedging rate, etc.);
- the risks inherent in the future value of the assets being hedged and the nature of the business of the corresponding subsidiaries.

## 1.4 SHARES

Thales was not exposed to any significant equity risk at end-2012, excluding the risk on treasury shares.

At 31 December 2012, Thales held 2,795,564 treasury shares, representing 1.38% of the share capital.

## 1.5 OFF-BALANCE-SHEET COMMITMENTS

## **1.5.1. PENSION COMMITMENTS**

Defined-benefit pension plans are in place for certain Thales employees, mainly in the United Kingdom and the Netherlands, and are externally funded by the company under the provisions of the applicable national legislation.

At 31 December 2012, Thales' commitments in the United Kingdom and the Netherlands toward current employees (access to these plans has been closed to new employees in the UK), former employees and retired employees amounted to €4,203m for both countries, hedged by €3,888m in investments, representing an underlying shortfall of €315m. At 31 December 2012, these investments consisted of:

- 35% in equities;
- 42% in fixed-rate bonds;
- 8% in inflation linked bonds;
- 8% in alternative liquid investments;
- 4.5% in alternative long-term investments (e.g. real estate and infrastructure);
- 2.5% in cash.

Changing market parameters could affect the amount of the shortfall and the annual costs of defined-benefit plans. At 31 December 2012, the main risk variables were as follows, listed in order of importance:

a reduction or increase in the discount rate applied to liabilities, which could increase or reduce the unfunded status; this variable is partly offset by changes in the value of fixed-rate bonds held as plan assets and interest rate swaps;

- changes in the total return on investments in equities and real estate;
- changes in the forecast inflation rate;
- a substantial change in mortality tables;
- exchange rate fluctuations (mainly sterling against the euro).

Thales has introduced quarterly reporting on its pension plan positions and makes regular deterministic and stochastic projections measuring the sensitivity of unfunded status to possible changes in market parameters taking into account correlation factors. In some countries, such as the UK and the Netherlands, Thales is committed to defined-benefit pension schemes, but plan assets are managed by trustees in accordance with the applicable regulations and in consultation with the Group. Plan assets are allocated with regard to the long-term nature of the commitments they cover.

## **1.5.2. PARENT COMPANY GUARANTEES**

Thales, as the parent company, issues guarantees on commitments undertaken by its subsidiaries on commercial contracts. These guarantees are centralised by the Group Corporate Financing & Treasury Department.

Guarantees are issued out of an envelope of €3bn dedicated each year to the Chairman and Chief Executive Officer by the Board of Directors. Prior to each renewal of the authority granted to the Chairman, the Group's Treasury and Funding Department reports to the Board of Directors on the level of use of this envelope, based on the monitoring carried out by the Group Corporate Financing & Treasury Department.

At 31 December 2012, outstanding guarantees issued by the parent company in support of its subsidiaries stood at €10,254m. This figure includes all commitments given in relation to Thales Alenia Space (matched by a counter-guarantee from Finmeccanica in proportion to its 33% interest in Thales Alenia Space).

Thales manages risks connected to these parent company guarantees and optimises the financial conditions of the transactions guaranteed. The main objectives of this risk management policy are as follows:

- to limit risks to those corresponding to normal commitments on commercial contracts, particularly in terms of volume and duration;
- to limit the issue of guarantees to commitments made by wholly-owned subsidiaries, with guarantees on commitments by consortia or joint ventures only in proportion to the Group's equity interest or counter-guaranteed by the other shareholder in proportion to its interest;

• to enable its subsidiaries to benefit, when appropriate, from the credit rating of the parent company by controlling the financial conditions of the transactions guaranteed.

## **1.6 CLIENT CREDIT**

Credit risk is the risk that a party to a contract will default on its contractual commitments or fail to pay what it owes.

#### 1.6.1. RISK RELATING TO DEFAULT OF A PRIVATE-SECTOR CUSTOMER

Non-governmental customers (aircraft manufacturers, airlines, private infrastructure operators and industry) account for approximately 25% of Thales's sales. These customers may encounter major and/or prolonged financial difficulties that could lead to payment defaults or order cancellations. Such occurrences could have a negative impact on Thales's sales, profitability and financial position.

To mitigate these risks, Thales conducts regular analysis of the ability of customers to meet their obligations. When necessary, Thales may request bank guarantees or corporate guarantees, or may use credit insurers.

#### 1.6.2. CREDIT RISK RELATING TO PUBLIC-SECTOR CUSTOMERS

Public, government and institutional customers account for around 75% of Thales's sales. Thales works with a large number of countries. Some of these could present a significant credit risk which could, for example, lead them to suspend an order in production, or make them be unable to pay on delivery, as agreed under the terms of the contract. To limit its exposure to these risks, Thales takes out insurance with export credit agencies (such as Coface in France) or private insurers.

At 31 December 2012, only two customers accounted for annual sales in excess of  $\bigcirc$  00m: the French State ( $\bigcirc$ .1bn, including O.8bn related to DCNS) and the British State (approx. Obn). At 31 December 2012, these two countries still have first-class or high quality ratings (France AA+ by S&P's and Aa1 by Moody's – UK AAA by S&P's and Aaa by Moody's).

## 2. LEGAL RISKS

## 2.1 COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS AND REGULATIONS

The Group operates its business in a strict and evolving complex legal and regulatory environment, both nationally and internationally.

The legal and regulatory framework in which Thales operates covers a broad range of areas, relating in particular to company law, financial market regulation, fiscal legislation, labour law, export control and measures to combat corruption and money laundering.

Thales is able to monitor developments within this legal and regulatory framework through its international network. The company is not always able to foresee them, however, and in this respect its business could be affected.

Despite the steps taken by Thales as a company to comply with all applicable legislation, risks still exist due to their inherent nature, the interpretative powers of regulatory agents and changes in legal/judicial precedent and sanctioning powers.

In most cases, regulators in conjunction with the judicial authorities have the right to initiate legal proceedings, which could expose the Group or its employees to civil, administrative or criminal rulings. Such a ruling could, if applicable, involve a temporary ban on trading, which would in turn have an adverse impact on the Group's profitability and financial position.

To manage this complexity, Thales has set up a Risks & Internal Control Committee, which uses legal and regulatory risk-mapping to evaluate and monitor the implementation and continuous improvement of compliance plans at each unit. Compliance actions rely for these needs on networks of compliance officers who may be specialists (export control), on risk sponsors in charge of the prevention of each of the major risks

identified and monitored by the Risks & Internal Control Committee, or on a dedicated organisation as regards international trade (cf. below).

The Risks & Internal Control Committee participates in the preparation of the annual audit plan and monitors the conclusions of the regular controls conducted by the Internal Audit department in these compliance areas.

Regular reports are submitted to the Audit and Accounts Committee of the Thales Board of Directors, which in turn may issue compliance audit directives within the entire Group.

### 2.1.1. MANAGEMENT OF COMMERCIAL ACTIVITIES

Because of its presence in more than 50 countries and the diversity of its markets and business segments, Thales is subject to national laws, particularly those resulting from the transposition of international conventions (OECD convention, UN convention to fight corruption, EU convention, Council of Europe conventions, etc.) and to international norms and standards to fight corruption.

Infringement of these laws could have serious legal consequences for the individuals or entities concerned. It could also have a significant impact on the image and reputation of the Group as a whole.

In response to the regulatory requirements in terms of prevention of corruption and business ethics in general, Thales has for a number of years operated a strict international compliance and integrity programme. This programme is regularly assessed and adjusted according to changes in external risks (new laws for example), internal risks (areas for improvement identified by the internal audit, the risks committee, etc.) and the Group's commercial strategy.

It is implemented on the basis of a coherent set of directives that is included in the Group's reference system, dedicated units and independent control resources.

Business risks are addressed throughout all governance processes. From the preliminary phase of a project, these operating processes envisage action plans to mitigate business risks, focusing particularly on the prevention of corruption.

Thales strictly governs the use of agents and consultants through a very detailed procedure, which requires indepth preliminary verifications (due diligence) – reinforced by the analysis of red flags or risk factors, as well as the appropriate representations and warranties from these consultants. Designed by the Group's Corporate Ethics and Responsibility Department, this process has been further reinforced, especially as regards recourse to consultants paid according to success fees.

In addition, to underpin its strategy of strengthening its presence internationally and its establishment in target countries, Thales upskills and selects local industrial partners. The upskilling and selection process is aimed at sealing long-term partnerships with local industrial companies that meet a series of criteria with regard to business integrity and ethics, competence and expertise. This procedure is also part of its effort to strengthen control processes and prevent corruption in purchasing.

An international, dedicated network, independent of the operational commercial structures, conducts the verifications required, enhanced by outside studies and diagnostics performed by companies that specialise in business intelligence – during the upskilling and selection phases for agents, consultants and local industrial partners for Thales.

In addition, by relying on risk mapping and rigorous internal control procedures, Thales' Internal Audit department regularly conducts compliance and integrity audit missions which cover all processes to manage commercial risks.

Thales is particularly keen to make its employees aware of ethical business conduct as soon as they join the Group. Ownership and accountability are key to the information and training model designed by the Ethics and Corporate Responsibility Department. A broad array of tools (Code of Ethics, reference guide, best practice guidelines, etc.) and training sessions (face-to-face training and e-learning is now available in French, English and German) are available to staff throughout their professional lives. Special attention is paid to employees

involved in the sales processes, project management and purchasing. The training plan for "Business Ethics and Preventing Corruption", which is world-wide in scope, is as a priority intended for this group of employees.

Thales also continues to disseminate and foster best practice among its suppliers and subcontractors, requiring them to subscribe to the terms of its Purchasing & Corporate Responsibility Charter. In connection with this, in France in 2012, Thales received government recognition for responsible supplier relations. This is a three-year label given to French businesses that have demonstrated long-term balanced relations with their suppliers.

Thales also actively participates in national professional organisations (MEDEF, GIFAS, ADS, etc.) and international organisations (ASD, ICC, B20, etc.), and within the working groups of intergovernmental organisations (OECD, United Nations, etc.). The Group actively participates in a variety of initiatives in the fight against corruption, both at European level (Business Ethics Committee of the ASD) and under the global sectoral initiative of the Aeronautics and Defence industries (IFBEC) which published its Public Accountability Report in October 2012 listing, in about 40 criteria, the level of maturity of business ethics programmes of the 20 member companies.

At the same time, Thales has been ranked in the defence sector's top 10 companies by Transparency International, an NGO working to combat corruption worldwide. The Transparency International report published in October 2012 presents an analysis of the corruption prevention programmes of the world's 129 biggest defence sector companies. The companies are assessed on five areas (leadership, governance and organisation – risk assessment – company codes and policies – training – personnel and helplines) with regard to the ethics and anti-corruption systems they have put in place.

In September 2012, the UN Global Compact, of which Thales has been a signatory since 2003, recognised the quality of Thales' ESG reporting and communication, raising its performance from "active" to "advanced". Among the 7,000 companies that are members of the Global Compact, only 386 (18 of them French) have so far obtained the Global Compact Advanced level.

#### 2.1.2. EXPORT CONTROL

Exports account for a significant proportion of Thales' business. Many of the Group's products and systems are designed for military or dual-use applications. Consequently, the export of these products or systems to customers located outside Thales' domestic markets where they are manufactured, particularly in the defence sector, may be subject to limitations, export licences or specific export controls (imposed by the countries in which Thales operates, as well as by other countries where the suppliers of component products or technologies are based, most notably the United States).

There are no guarantees that (i) the export controls to which Thales is subject will not be tightened, (ii) newgeneration products or systems developed by Thales will not be subject to similar or tighter controls and, (iii) geopolitical factors will not make it impossible for Thales or its suppliers to obtain export licences for certain customers or make it more difficult for Thales to execute previously signed contracts. Further limitations on access to military markets would thus have a negative impact on Thales' business, profitability and financial position.

Thales has put in place systems and formal procedures to ensure compliance with applicable regulations and controls, and reinforces these measures through awareness-raising programmes with dedicated e-learning modules. Operating units have access to a network of specialists within the Group, in charge of applying the compliance rules determined at Group level as well as monitoring the necessary authorisations and conformity of their implementation.

## 2.1.3. COMPETITION

Thales' business activities are subject to a wide range of national and international regulations mainly aimed at combating anti-competitive practices.

Infringement of these rules could lead to severe sanctions, such as fines, payment of damages, trading restrictions and legal bans. They could also have a serious impact on corporate image and reputation.

To avoid any such infringements, Thales has initiated an awareness-raising programme to ensure that employees are properly informed about these rules, in particular through the rollout of a dedicated e-learning programme.

## 2.1.4. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

Thales is exposed to two main types of intellectual property risk: dependence on third-party technology and third-party actions against the company for any perceived infringement of their intellectual property rights.

To reduce the risk of reliance on third-party technology, Thales has designed and implemented an ambitious policy to control business- critical technology and outsourcing. This policy is updated each year.

Given the nature of its activities and the specific features of its products, Thales conducts most of its research and development work in-house and controls the technology which is critical to the business. Thales is one of the largest filer of patents in France and was recognised in 2012 by Thomson Reuters as one of the 100 most innovative companies in the world. Thales' extensive intellectual property portfolio (over 13,000 patents, as well as software and know-how) and its presence throughout the value chain (equipment, systems and systems of systems) reduce its reliance on third-party technology. As a result, Thales' dependence on such technology can be considered very low.

To reduce the risk of third-party actions for alleged infringement of their intellectual property rights by Thales entities, the Group identifies and analyses this risk in the context of its own patent filing procedures and/or when embarking on technical research or product development.

In the event of a third-party infringement claim against a Thales company, the legal and technical analysis of the allegedly infringing products and intellectual property rights are handled centrally by Thales experts, with the assistance of specialist external consultants where needed.

## 2.2 LITIGATION

Due to the nature of its business activities, Thales is exposed to the risk of technical and commercial litigation.

To prevent disputes or limit their impact, Thales policy is to systematically seek alternative methods of dispute resolution. This policy is reviewed on a regular basis to take into account changes in the company's core areas of business and is backed by employee training programmes.

In addition, Thales implemented a procedure several years ago to centralise all civil and business litigation and enforcement procedures. These are handled by the headquarters legal affairs department, with the support of the Group companies concerned.

At the end of 2002, a group of French manufacturers, including Thales and one of its subsidiaries, collectively received a request for arbitration relating to the execution of old contracts. In proportion to each industrial partner's involvement, Thales would have been liable for around 20% of the total claim of \$260m. Under an agreement signed in 2003, the client withdrew its request for arbitration.

In November 2012, the claimant filed a new request for arbitration for a revised amount of 226m. The parties are strongly challenging this claim and at this date it is not possible to evaluate any potential financial risk. Consequently, Thales has not recognised any provision.

## 3. RISKS RELATED TO THALES'S BUSINESSES

## **3.1 COMPETITIVE ENVIRONMENT**

The markets in which Thales operates are highly competitive, both in terms of international groups, especially in a context of shrinking defence budgets in their home countries, and in terms of local or niche companies in certain market segments. This competitive pressure could negatively impact Thales' commercial position, sales and profits.

There is also no guarantee that competition will not intensify, particularly in an unfavourable environment, or that Thales will be able to successfully fight its current or future competitors.

In order to limit the impact of this risk, Thales continues its research and development efforts in order to provide competitive and differentiating elements to the Group's operating units and also works to upgrade its product offer in order to meet the needs of its customers, in both defence and civil markets.

## 3.2 UNFAVOURABLE TRENDS IN THE CIVIL AVIATION MARKET

The commercial aviation market has proved to be inherently cyclical over recent decades. Demand for air travel appears closely linked to general economic trends, but is also affected by specific factors, such as the characteristics of aircraft fleets in service, regulatory changes (new environmental standards, deregulation, etc.) and the ability of airlines to access bank or market financing. In addition to its cyclical nature, the civil aviation market is also susceptible to the effects of intensification (real or perceived) of terrorist activity, as well as the outbreak of conflict or epidemics.

The economic environment is therefore likely to remain unsettled, especially in North America and Europe. In order to remain profitable in a difficult market, airlines could cancel or postpone orders and aircraft manufacturers might have to reduce production rates. This environment could also lead the airlines to reduce or delay their maintenance expenditure or their investments in in-flight entertainment systems. Were they to materialise, these factors could have a negative impact on Thales' profitability and financial position.

To limit the impact of this risk, Thales is pursuing action on two fronts: (i) ongoing improvements to its competitive performance and industrial flexibility in order to better manage trading fluctuations during the cycle and (ii) a comprehensive strategy seeking a balance within the business portfolio (with exposure to the civil aviation market reduced to around 15% of Group sales).

## **3.3 DEPENDENCE ON PUBLIC PROCUREMENT**

Thales generates most of its business from governments, particularly in the defence markets in France and the UK, and, to a lesser extent, in the rest of Europe and North America. In these markets, public spending is dependent on political and economic factors and is therefore likely to fluctuate from one year to the next. A significant reduction in defence budgets, particularly in Europe as part of a more restrictive budget policy, could affect the Group's business and profitability. In effect, a reduction in the budget resources of government customers could generate delays in order booking, contract execution, payments or a decrease in funding for research and development programmes.

Thales has based its strategy on a balanced portfolio of defence operations (approximately 55% of sales) and civil operations (approximately 45% of sales). The overall solidity of the portfolio is underpinned by a diversified base of orders with a unit value of less than  $\in 100$ m. Finally, the broad geographic spread of Thales' business, particularly through its international operations, ensures further diversification of its customer base.

## **3.4 CONTROL OF PROJECTS AND PROGRAMMES**

Many of Thales' products and systems are highly complex due to their advanced technology content, the rigorous constraints and harsh environments in which they operate (which require them to be extremely reliable) and the contractual arrangements surrounding their sale (comprehensive prime contractorships for large-scale systems, public-private partnerships or equivalent, etc.).

The actual cost of design, development and manufacture may therefore exceed initial cost estimates, which in turn may adversely impact Thales' results and financial position, especially considering that the associated contracts are generally based on a fixed, all-inclusive price. In addition, many contracts provide for stringent performance levels and/ or tight delivery schedules for the products or systems sold. If Thales is unable to deliver these products or systems in line with the required level of performance and/or delivery schedule, customers may demand penalty payments or even decide to terminate the contract. The occurrence of such events could have a material impact on Thales' results and financial position.

Bid and project management is therefore subject to a detailed risk management and assessment process. Thales ranks the various levels of criticality. Critical bids and projects are specifically monitored at the management level of the operating entities and, as needed, by the Group's executive management.

Contractual risk assessment is an integral part of the tendering process. Depending on the complexity of the bid, this procedure involves a number of steps which progressively reveal the estimated level of profitability and the associated risks to be assessed. Particular attention is paid to long-term sales contracts that include fixed prices valid for the entire duration of the agreement.

For certain contracts that run for several years and involve products and services with a high degree of complexity, regular reviews are organised in order to monitor the technical and financial progress.

The Group therefore continues to pay particular attention to analyses and action plans for "non-quality costs", with annual targets set for each entity and systematic measurement of negative variances by project and analysis of their root causes.

The Group also continued action plans to improve the management of bids and projects, engineering and the supply chain. These actions aim in particular to:

improve the management of commitments made, with widespread use of independent peer reviews, closer involvement of Purchasing, Production, Legal and Quality Control and the introduction of a "Project Design Authority" responsible for developing the project solution (during the bid or project execution phase);

- identify the centres of expertise (R&D, integration, production and services) within Thales in order to increase synergies and expertise and provide the best responses to the solution;
- improve the development of product lines in order to streamline new developments and thus reduce risks;
- implement tried-and-tested project management solutions which include the supply chain in project management processes;
- introduce advanced training for project managers to obtain International Project Management Association (IPMA) certification. In 2012, over 200 project managers gained IPMA certification.

## 3.5 POLITICAL RISKS

Thales generates a significant proportion of its sales in emerging markets and countries that can be, or could become, politically or economically unstable. These markets might therefore present risks with the potential to affect the Group's profitability and financial position.

In particular, a change in government, major political event, armed conflict, act of terrorism, sharp deterioration in the balance of payments, industrial action, strike or protest could lead to various types of risks. These include:

- more restrictive currency control, with limitations or exclusions on withdrawing currency from a client country, preventing it from honouring its financial commitments towards Thales;
- impairment of assets because of devaluations of the local currency or other measures taken by public authorities that significantly affect the value of operations;
- expropriation (by confiscation, nationalisation, requisition, etc.) or the forced sale of Thales' interest in a local company or, more broadly, discriminatory measures that compromise Thales' operations in a country;
- a security situation entailing a risk of attack on the physical safety of its employees and/or its facilities, which strongly limit or prevent Thales from assuming its performance obligations under a contract, or reduce or prohibit the use of its local industrial assets;

- an unexpected breach of a contract or commitment;
- an unfair call of a bond or a guarantee;
- the non-certification of documents eligible for payment, or non- payment on the due dates stipulated in a contract, which prevent the anticipated progress of that contract.

To limit the financial impact of these risks, Thales uses government and/or private-sector insurers when necessary to provide appropriate cover. It may also transfer receivables without recourse to financial institutions.

In addition, the Group has deployed a global procedure for employee security, protection and monitoring to ensure they have an appropriate level of security in the countries in which they perform their work.

## 3.6 VIOLATIONS OF DATA CONFIDENTIALITY

Thales is exposed to the risk of attacks on the security of its industrial infrastructures or its information technology systems (hacking attempts to access confidential information, threats to the physical security of facilities, etc.). The occurrence of such events could affect the rollout of the Group's activities and its reputation and, consequently, its results and financial situation.

In its defence businesses, the Group is subject to different national regulations requiring it to implement measures to protect its employees and industrial assets.

The Group is therefore subject to a large number of audits and inspections by the national supervisory authorities.

The Group has also established internal policies to protect its sites and sensitive information systems and increase employee awareness. These policies, which are replicated in all the subsidiaries, are relayed by the network of information system safety and security officers in the countries and divisions. For example, the application of Thales' "Information System Security" policy, based on ISO 27000, relies on the secure architecture of its information system, the critical awareness of users and IT personnel and appropriate means of monitoring and surveillance; it is regularly assessed through audits, vulnerability tests and surveys.

## 3.7 MANAGEMENT OF SUPPLIER RISK

Purchases constitute a very significant proportion of Thales' business, representing nearly half its sales in manufacturing, services, equipment and sub-systems. Thales is thus exposed to the risk of industrial, technical or financial failure of any of its suppliers, which in turn could affect the company's profitability and performance.

There are two major types of supplier risk:

- legal or regulatory non-compliance (e.g. ethics, export control, intellectual property, etc.); these risks are handled by the departments concerned using the Group Risk Management system, with the support of the Purchasing Department;
- structural and operational risks that could disrupt supply are dealt with by the Purchasing Department using the Group Risk Management system. The Purchasing Department has identified two key triggers: supplier default and economic dependence. Although individual events might be considered to have a minor financial impact, they could potentially occur several times a year. The financial impact could become significant if several events are considered together, due to the domino effect and the large number of suppliers in Thales' supplier panel.

#### Management of the risks of supplier default

Supplier default could be caused by a major incident at one of its sites, by its external environment (shortage of raw materials or components, major political instability, natural disaster, etc.) or through mismanagement. The supplier's management performance is monitored both in operating terms (lack of procurement planning, failure to manage tier 2 suppliers, loss of control over industrial processes, plant obsolescence, etc.) and in cross-

disciplinary and financial terms (poor talent management, loss of know-how, fall in sales, mismanagement of working capital requirement, cash flow problems, administration or bankruptcy protection, etc.). A combination of problems could lead to the disappearance of a company or its takeover by investors with different interests from those of Thales.

Faced with this risk of a supply shortage, Thales seeks to implement a dual sourcing (or alternative-source) policy for each technology family, regularly updated and accompanied by buffer stocks that cover its requirements until customer contracts have been fulfilled.

In addition, taking into account the increased risk of fragility of certain suppliers in the current economic climate, Thales has introduced a special measure aimed at identifying, from among its critical suppliers, those that would be particularly exposed financially and implementing an appropriate action plan to ensure continuity of supply. Apart from individual monitoring, analysis is carried out by technology field in conjunction with the professional bodies concerned to identify appropriate solutions.

Alongside these financial supervision measures, Purchasing and Quality Control have stepped up their appraisal, accreditation and management of supplier performance to better identify structural risks. Supplier performance audits are broad-based (quality control, industrial maturity, flow optimisation, compliance with environmental regulations, expertise in technical and technological processes, financial solidity, etc.) and therefore allow a complete risk analysis to be carried out. When executing a purchasing contract, Thales closely monitors the implementation by the supplier of measures aimed at tackling the risks identified during the selection process.

#### Management of the risks of economic dependence

The economic dependence of small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) on Thales is considered a separate risk in its own right. It is particularly significant now that the economic crisis has disrupted the sales portfolios of a number of them, jeopardising the operating cycle with Thales and potentially leading to a supply shortage.

In order to mitigate this risk, the commitment rate (orders placed by Thales as a percentage of the supplier's total annual sales) is monitored for each panel of suppliers by market segment and for the main countries (France, the UK, the Netherlands, etc.). If the commitment rate exceeds 50% for more than two consecutive years, an action plan coordinated with internal prescriptors and internal users is drawn up and implemented in order to return to a reduced commitment rate.

The procurement policy, supplier selection and performance monitoring processes and supervisory and risk mitigation measures are all designed to reduce these risks, both during the bidding phase and during the preliminary project phase.

## **3.8 RISK RELATED TO FAILURE OF EQUIPMENT OR TECHNOLOGY**

Thales systems and equipment are highly complex and technical and are likely to be integrated within highvalue civil or military platforms. A malfunction of any such systems, equipment or technologies could result in client claims or third-party litigation. Thales could thus be held liable in the event of damage to property or personal injury. Were they to occur, such events would be liable to impact Thales' results and financial position, as well as its reputation.

In order to limit the impact, Thales has put Group-wide procedures in place (risk management, Design Authority, quality, documentation and contractualisation). In addition, Thales conducts a policy to maintain appropriate insurance coverage (see Section 6 below).

## **3.9 RISK RELATED TO RAW MATERIALS**

Given the nature of its business, Thales uses few raw materials. Its exposure to raw materials risk is therefore negligible.

## 3.10 RISK OF LOWER IMPACT OF PERFORMANCE IMPROVEMENT MEASURES

At the beginning of 2010, Thales initiated a global performance plan that is designed to increase the Group's operating profitability, by improving project execution and industrial efficiency and reducing overheads in order to narrow the operating profitability gap with its European peers.

The actual results may differ significantly from the objectives. In particular, the cost-cutting measures planned by the Group are based on economic and commercial assumptions defined during the preparation of the Group's multi-year budget and do not take into consideration any potential changes that could affect Thales' operations or its markets, such as the development of new activities, increased competition in its domestic and export markets or unfavourable regulatory or legislative changes.

Furthermore, the future earnings and financial position of Thales could be negatively impacted if the proposed measures could not be fully implemented or if they failed to generate the expected savings according to the original timetable. The cost of implementing these measures could also be higher than forecast, depending particularly on the outcome of negotiations with employee representatives.

Thales pays particular attention to the management and monitoring of performance improvement actions. The Group's corporate management regularly reviews the progress of the main actions. Savings forecasts for the year are regularly updated as part of the budgeting process.

## 3.11 HUMAN RESOURCES RISK

## 3.11.1 HEALTH AND SAFETY AT WORK

Ensuring a healthy and safe working environment for its employees pursuant to the laws in force, monitoring procedures, preventing health and professional risks and employee training are key priorities for Thales.

These principles are reflected in a structure designed to prevent risks related to health and safety in the workplace. Concrete measures are implemented to anticipate and manage health risks that might occur at the international level. The creation of a permanent health supervision unit, a crisis unit in the event of a major international health risk and the implementation of a specific procedure for missions in countries posing a major health risk all contribute to better management of the risks in this area. Finally, regular and specific monitoring of the risks (discriminatory practices, moral and sexual harassment, injuries to health such as professional or psycho-social risks, etc.) that could affect the Group's employees is conducted every year on the basis of specialised indicators. Undertakings have also been made by the Group HR department on employees' occupational health and safety worldwide, such as the possibility of having a medical in the year of recruitment, the particular attention paid to isolated or night work, and informing employees about health and safety at work relating to their work environment.

Thales is also committed to increasing the quality of life in the workplace. In France, negotiations have been conducted with trade union organisations at Group level with the aim of reaching agreement in 2013 on a new "Quality of Life at Work" policy. This would follow on from the agreement signed in 2009, which defined a general framework for prevention, with a particular focus on the detection and prevention of psychosocial risks by implementing preventative actions at employee level and by collective prevention measures.

Proof of the Group's continuing commitment to certification, 94 Thales entities (representing 67% of the workforce) had obtained OHSAS 18001 certification by the end of 2012.

## 3.11.2 ATTRACTIVENESS

If Thales is not attractive enough to recruit the qualified staff it needs in a timely manner and retain and motivate its employees to develop and conduct its business, sales and operating profitability could be negatively affected. Thales' success and performance effectively depend on the quality and commitment of its employees who are highly skilled in key areas, as well as its capacity to recruit the employees necessary for its development and the conduct of its business in different job markets in France and abroad.

Thales therefore attaches great importance to its attractiveness and positioning as a top employer, ensuring a good external image which will boost recruitment and an internal situation that will contribute to retaining employees.

As an attractive and recognised employer in France, Thales also intends to build its image in all the countries where the Group is already present or is intending to develop. To do this, in 2012 Thales initiated an international communication campaign in the main countries in which it operates. This campaign is based on five main areas which reflect Thales' personality as an employer: passion, professional development, the Group's mission, team spirit and diversity.

For several years, Thales has operated a dynamic skills management policy in the Group's main professional families. A steering committee by family, composed of operational and HR managers, analyses developments in the businesses and expertise and the needs of the company, and establishes appropriate action plans (recruitment, mobility, training etc.). Within this framework, a list of key skills has been defined by professional family so that the engineers and managers concerned can self-declare their core skills. Thanks to this policy's success with employees, 75% of whom have declared their skills, Thales has been able to make further improvements in skills management. To complement this tool, each year the Group's internal University updates the key programmes in response to changing needs.

The Group is also expanding its search for new talent by deploying a voluntary policy of diversity, hiring employees with varied backgrounds in terms of training, experience and culture.

Thales' appeal also stems from its employment policy, which encourages functional and geographical mobility.

## 4. ENVIRONMENTAL RISKS

Due to the nature of Thales's activities, environmental risks are related to potential adverse environmental and health effects of these activities, impact of the environment on its operations and non-compliance with new regulations applicable to activities and to products.

For many years, Thales has conducted regular analysis and update of environmental risks in accordance with its business activities, scientific and technical developments and the emerging environmental challenges.

This analysis is being used to map risks related to regulatory non-compliance, pollution, asbestos, substances (ROHS, REACH, WEEE etc) and radiations. It aims at:

- ensuring that employees and surrounding residents are not exposed to health and environmental risks;
- ensuring the compliance of activities and products;
- analyzing the impact of new regulations, including on product design;
- specifying an appropriate organisation and associated action plans, either at Group level or locally, according to the risk mapping results.

In addition to this, an environmental management system has been deployed at all sites in order to ensure the control and limitation of the products and sites environmental impacts in accordance with Thales's commitments. As such, environmental competences have been widened to include engineering, research, procurement and contracts. By the end of 2012, 124 sites had obtained ISO 14001 certification.

At 31 December 2012, the amount of reserves for environmental contingencies amounted to €7.4m.

## 5. RISKS RELATING TO STRATEGIC ACQUISITIONS AND INVESTMENTS

Thales regularly looks to acquire new companies (as well as making strategic investments and combining business activities through joint ventures, etc.) in order to round out its technological portfolio and strengthen its presence in certain markets. Integrating these businesses within Thales could prove more difficult and take

longer than envisaged, requiring a more significant involvement by senior managers and the teams concerned and, in turn, negatively impacting the company's results and financial position.

In addition, there are no guarantees that the newly acquired companies will perform as well as expected in accordance with the initial business plans, which form the basis of the investment decision. This type of variance could lead to the recognition of impairment losses on goodwill and other intangible assets, thereby negatively impacting Thales' results and financial position.

Before any planned acquisitions, Thales conducts audits and due diligence with the assistance of external consultants where necessary, in order to analyse the fundamentals of the target company. A review is also conducted at each key stage in the acquisition process to confirm Thales' interest and specify the necessary conditions and parameters to ensure a successful outcome. The newly acquired company is then integrated into Thales' financial reporting system so that its performance can be monitored.

## 6. INSURANCE

Thales' Insurance and Risk Management department, based at head office, is responsible for the Group's insurance activities and insurable risk management. It is in charge of Group operations and oversees policy implementation by Group companies.

The Group covers the financial consequences of the risk of accidental damage suffered or caused by property or people using appropriate insurance policies with leading international insurance and reinsurance companies.

The insurance policies arranged by the Group to cover these major risks relate to areas such as:

- damage to property and consequent operating losses;
- transport;
- testing and development;
- aviation liability, including liability for aeronautical products and hull/test flight insurance;
- civil liability for space products;
- risks of damage to or by naval vessels by subsidiaries, as naval equipment suppliers;
- general third-party liability;
- environmental liability;
- liability of executive officers and directors.

The Group had no major loss in 2012.

Thales' policy is to arrange cover on the insurance market based on the rates and limits that it considers reasonable, in view of the conditions offered by the market. Limits are applicable to insurance for major risks, while general exclusions for the entire market (e.g. asbestos) also apply to Thales.

The maximum coverage limit of e.3bn in 2012 for damage to property and consequent business interruptions represents an estimate of the maximum loss caused to an industrial site which the Group could incur for direct damages and business interruptions.

Levels of liability cover depend on the quantification of a reasonable claim expectancy for Thales, as identified by the risk map of the main business activities and at Group level, and on cover capacity available on the insurance market. The insurance coverage for aviation liability commitments, which is covered by a specific programme, amounts to USD 2bn.

The insurance industry, which was affected by the recent financial crisis, is still trying to reduce its overall risk exposure. Thales is witnessing an increase in insurance premiums, a rise in deductibles and additional limits on the scope of cover. In addition, there are fewer insurers with the necessary resources and financial capacity to insure major industrial risks. There are no guarantees that Thales will be able in the future to maintain current levels of insurance under similar financial conditions.

In order to reduce its exposure to insurance market volatility, Thales insures major risks on a two-tier basis:

- the Group's contribution, through captive insurance and reinsurance companies, towards the settlement of claims, to a maximum net commitment of €13.5m per year, for damage to property and consequent business interruptions, transport, general third-party liability, testing and development and space risks;
- transfer to insurers of payment for catastrophic losses.

An active Prevention and Protection policy for industrial sites is designed to reduce the magnitude and frequency of the accidental risks of fire or explosion and to detect other vulnerabilities, such as exposure to environmental or natural disasters affecting critical industrial facilities. In 2012, more than 80% of the assets insured were the subject of a "multi-peril" audit by the insurers during their visits to the principal operating sites and fire safety inspections by an outside organisation.

In accordance with Group processes, measures were taken to minimise business interruption and the consequences of any unforeseen events. An organisational structure and crisis management tools are in place to deal as efficiently as possible with the immediate consequences of a catastrophic event and to take the necessary emergency measures.

Thales continues to roll out professional indemnity cover for its staff. In addition, specific and/or local cover has been arranged to comply with the regulations in force and to satisfy the specific requirements of certain activities or projects, particularly public-private partnerships.

#### **RISK FACTORS RELATING TO THE NOTES**

#### GENERAL RISKS RELATING TO THE NOTES

#### Independent Review and Advice

Each prospective investor of Notes must determine, based on its own independent review and such professional advice as it deems appropriate under the circumstances, that its acquisition of the Notes is fully consistent with its financial needs, objectives and condition, complies and is fully consistent with all investment policies, guidelines and restrictions applicable to it and is a fit, proper and suitable investment for it, notwithstanding the clear and substantial risks inherent in investing in or holding the Notes.

Some Notes are complex financial instruments. Sophisticated institutional investors generally do not purchase complex financial instruments as stand-alone investments. They purchase complex financial instruments as a way to reduce risk or enhance yield with an understood, measured, appropriate addition of risk to their overall portfolios. A potential investor should not invest in Notes which are complex financial instruments unless it has the expertise (either alone or with a financial adviser) to evaluate how the Notes will perform under changing conditions, the resulting effects on the value of the Notes and the impact this investment will have on the potential investor's overall investment portfolio.

A prospective investor may not rely on the Issuer or the Dealer(s) or any of their respective affiliates in connection with its determination as to the legality of its acquisition of the Notes or as to the other matters referred to above.

#### The trading market for debt securities may be volatile and may be adversely impacted by many events.

The market for debt securities issued by issuers is influenced by economic and market conditions and, to varying degrees, market conditions, interest rates, currency exchange rates and inflation rates in other European and other industrialised countries. There can be no assurance that events in Luxembourg, Europe or elsewhere will not cause market volatility or that such volatility will not adversely affect the price of Notes or that economic and market conditions will not have any other adverse effect.

#### An active trading market for the Notes may not develop.

There can be no assurance that an active trading market for the Notes will develop, or, if one does develop, that it will be maintained. If an active trading market for the Notes does not develop or is not maintained, the market or trading price and liquidity of the Notes may be adversely affected. The Issuer and any of its subsidiaries are entitled to buy the Notes, as described in Condition 11, and the Issuer may issue further notes, as described in Condition 19. Such transactions may favourably or adversely affect the price development of the Notes. If additional and competing products are introduced in the markets, this may adversely affect the value of the Notes.

### Market Value of the Notes

The market value of the Notes will be affected by the creditworthiness of the relevant Issuer and a number of additional factors, including market interest and yield rates and the time remaining to the maturity date.

The value of the Notes depends on a number of interrelated factors, including economic, financial and political events in France or elsewhere, including factors affecting capital markets generally and the stock exchanges on which the Notes are traded. The price at which a Noteholder will be able to sell the Notes prior to maturity may be at a discount, which could be substantial, from the issue price or the purchase price paid by such purchaser.

#### Exchange rate risks and exchange controls.

The Issuer will pay principal and interest on the Notes in the Specified Currency as defined in "Terms and Conditions of the Notes" below. This presents certain risks relating to currency conversions if an investor's financial activities are denominated principally in a currency or currency unit (the "**Investor's Currency**") other than the Specified Currency. These include the risk that exchange rates may significantly change (including changes due to devaluation of the Specified Currency or revaluation of the Investor's Currency) and the risk that authorities with jurisdiction over the Investor's Currency may impose or modify exchange controls. An appreciation in the value of the Investor's Currency relative to the Specified Currency would decrease (1) the Investor's Currency-equivalent yield on the Notes, (2) the Investor's Currency-equivalent value of the principal payable on the Notes and (3) the Investor's Currency-equivalent market value of the Notes.

Government and monetary authorities may impose (as some have done in the past) exchange controls that could adversely affect an applicable exchange rate. As a result, investors may receive less interest or principal than expected, or no interest or principal.

#### Credit risk

The value of the Notes will also depend on the credit worthiness of the Issuer. If the credit worthiness of the Issuer deteriorates, the value of the Notes may decrease and investors may lose all or part of their investment.

#### Legal investment considerations may restrict certain investments

The investment activities of certain investors are subject to legal investment laws and regulations, or review or regulation by certain authorities. Each potential investor should consult its legal advisers to determine whether and to what extent (1) Notes are legal investments for it, (2) Notes can be used as collateral for various types of borrowing and (3) other restrictions apply to its purchase or pledge of any Notes. Financial institutions, insurance companies and other regulated entities should consult their legal advisors or the appropriate regulators to determine the appropriate treatment of Notes under any applicable risk-based capital or similar rules.

#### A Noteholder's actual yield on the Notes may be reduced from the stated yield by transaction costs

When Notes are purchased or sold, several types of incidental costs (including transaction fees and commissions) are incurred in addition to the current price of the security. These incidental costs may significantly reduce or even exclude the profit potential of the Notes. For instance, credit institutions as a rule charge their clients for own commissions which are either fixed minimum commissions or pro-rata commissions depending on the order value. To the extent that additional – domestic or foreign – parties are involved in the execution of an order, including but not limited to domestic dealers or brokers in foreign markets, Noteholders must take into account that they may also be charged for the brokerage fees, commissions and other fees and expenses of such parties (third party costs).

In addition to such costs directly related to the purchase of securities (direct costs), Noteholders must also take into account any follow-up costs (such as custody fees). Investors should inform themselves about any additional costs incurred in connection with the purchase, custody or sale of the Notes before investing in the Notes.

#### Credit ratings may not reflect all risks.

One or more independent credit rating agencies may assign credit ratings to the Notes or to the Issuer. The ratings may not reflect the potential impact of all risks related to structure, market, additional factors discussed above, and other factors that may affect the value of the Notes. A credit rating is not a recommendation to buy, sell or hold securities and may be revised or withdrawn by the rating agency at any time.

#### Taxation

Potential purchasers and sellers of the Notes should be aware that they may be required to pay taxes or other documentary charges or duties in accordance with the laws and practices of the country where the Notes are transferred or other jurisdictions. In some jurisdictions, no official statements of the tax authorities or court decisions may be available for innovative financial Notes. Potential investors are advised not to rely upon the tax summary contained in this Base Prospectus and/or in the Final Terms but to ask for their own tax adviser's advice on their individual taxation with respect to the acquisition, sale and redemption of the Notes. Only these advisors are in a position to duly consider the specific situation of the potential investor. This investment consideration has to be read in connection with the taxation sections of this Base Prospectus and the additional tax sections, if any, contained in the relevant Final Terms.

#### **EU Savings Directive**

Under EC Council Directive 2003/48/EC on the taxation of savings income, Member States are required to provide to the tax authorities of another Member State details of payments of interest (or similar income) paid by a person located within its jurisdiction to an individual resident in that other Member State (the "**Disclosure of Information Method**"). However, for a transitional period, Luxembourg and Austria are instead required (unless during that period they elect otherwise) to operate a withholding system in relation to such payments (the ending of such transitional period being dependent upon the conclusion of certain other agreements relating to information exchange with certain other countries). A number of non-EU countries and territories have adopted similar measures. On 10 April 2013, the Luxembourg government announced that the 35% withholding tax will be anticipatively and unilaterally replaced in Luxembourg by the Disclosure of Information Method as of 1 January 2015.

If a payment were to be made or collected through a Member State which has opted for a withholding system and an amount of, or in respect of, tax were to be withheld from that payment, neither the Issuer nor any Paying Agent nor any other person would be obliged to pay additional amounts with respect to any Note as a result of the imposition of such withholding tax. If a withholding tax is imposed on a payment made by a Paying Agent, the Issuer is required to maintain a Paying Agent in a Member State that is not obliged to withhold or deduct tax pursuant to the Directive.

In relation to French taxation, the Directive has been implemented in French law under Article 242 *ter* of the French *Code Général des Impôts* and Articles 49 I *ter* to 49 I *sexies* of the Schedule III to the *Code Général des Impôts*. Please also refer to the "**Taxation**" Section, "*EU Savings Directive*".

#### French insolvency law.

Under French insolvency law as amended by ordinance n°2008-1345 dated 18 December 2008 which came into force on 15 February 2009, holders of debt securities are automatically grouped into a single assembly of holders (the "Assembly") during a preservation (*procédure de sauvegarde*) or a judicial reorganisation procedure (*procédure de redressement judiciaire*) of the Issuer, in order to defend their common interests. The Assembly comprises holders of all debt securities issued by the Issuer (including the Notes), whether or not under a debt issuance programme (EMTN) and regardless of their governing law. The Assembly deliberates on the draft safeguard (*projet de plan de sauvegarde*) or judicial reorganisation plan (*projet de plan de redressement*) applicable to the Issuer and may further agree to:

- increase the liabilities (*charges*) of holders of debt securities (including the Noteholders) by rescheduling and/or writing-off debts;
- establish an unequal treatment between holders of debt securities (including the Noteholders) as appropriate under the circumstances; and/or
- decide to convert debt securities (including the Notes) into shares.

Decisions of the Assembly will be taken by a two-third majority (calculated as a proportion of the debt securities held by the holders attending such Assembly or represented thereat). No quorum is required on convocation of the Assembly.

For the avoidance of doubt, the provisions relating to the meetings of the Noteholders described in this Base Prospectus will not be applicable in these circumstances.

## RISKS RELATED TO THE STRUCTURE OF A PARTICULAR ISSUE OF NOTES

#### The Notes may be redeemed prior to maturity.

Unless in the case of any particular Tranche of Notes the relevant Final Terms specify otherwise, in the event that the Issuer would be obliged to increase the amounts payable in respect of any Notes due to any withholding or deduction for or on account of, any present or future taxes, duties, assessments or governmental charges of whatever nature imposed, levied, collected, withheld or assessed by or on behalf of the jurisdiction of the Issuer or a political subdivision thereof or any authority therein or thereof having power to tax, the Issuer may redeem all outstanding Notes in accordance with the Conditions.

## Any early redemption at the option of the Issuer, if provided for in any Final Terms for a particular issue of Notes, could cause the yield anticipated by Noteholders to be considerably less than anticipated.

The Final Terms for a particular issue of Notes may provide for early redemption at the option of the Issuer. Such right of termination is often provided for bonds or notes in periods of high interest rates. If the market interest rates decrease, the risk to Noteholders that the Issuer will exercise its right of termination increases. As a consequence, the yields received upon redemption may be lower than expected, and the redeemed face amount of the Notes may be lower than the purchase price for the Notebolder in such case would not receive the total amount of the capital invested. In addition, investors that choose to reinvest monies they receive through an early redemption may be able to do so only in securities with a lower yield than the redeemed Notes.

#### **RISKS RELATED TO INTEREST RATES**

#### Investors will not be able to calculate in advance their rate of return on Floating Rate Notes.

A key difference between Floating Rate Notes and Fixed Rate Notes is that interest income on Floating Rate Notes cannot be anticipated. Due to varying interest income, investors are not able to determine a definite yield

of Floating Rate Notes at the time they purchase them, so that their return on investment cannot be compared with that of investments having longer fixed interest periods. If the terms and conditions of the notes provide for frequent interest payment dates, investors are exposed to the reinvestment risk if market interest rates decline. That is, investors may reinvest the interest income paid to them only at the relevant lower interest rates then prevailing.

#### Zero Coupon Notes are subject to higher price fluctuations than non-discounted bonds.

Changes in market interest rates have a substantially stronger impact on the prices of Zero Coupon Notes than on the prices of ordinary Notes because the discounted issue prices are substantially below par. If market interest rates increase, Zero Coupon Notes can suffer higher price losses than other Notes having the same maturity and credit rating. Due to their leverage effect, Zero Coupon Notes are a type of investment associated with a particularly high price risk.

#### Variable rate Notes with a multiplier or other leverage factor

Notes with variable interest rates can be volatile investments. If they are structured to include multipliers or other leverage factors, or caps or floors, or any combination of those features, their market values may be even more volatile than those for securities that do not include those features.

#### Fixed Interest Rate Risk

In relation to the Notes bearing interest at a fixed rate, investment in the Notes involves the risk that subsequent changes in market interest rates may adversely affect the value of the Notes. While the nominal interest rate of a fixed interest rate bond is fixed during the life of such a bond or during a certain period of time, the current interest rate on the capital market (market interest rate) typically changes on a daily basis. As the market interest rate changes, the price of such bond changes in the opposite direction. If the market interest rate increases, the price of such bond typically falls, until the yield of such bond is approximately equal to the market interest rate. If the market interest rate decreases, the price of a fixed rate bond typically increases, until the yield of such bond is approximately equal to the market interest rate. Noteholders should be aware that movements of the market interest rate can adversely affect the price of the Notes and can lead to losses for the Noteholders if they sell Notes during the period in which the market interest rate exceeds the fixed rate of the Notes.

## SUPPLEMENT TO THE BASE PROSPECTUS

If at any time the Issuer shall be required to prepare a supplement to this Base Prospectus pursuant to the provisions of Article 16 of the Prospectus Directive and Article 212-25 of the *Règlement Général* of the AMF, the Issuer will prepare and make available an appropriate supplement to this Base Prospectus or a further Base Prospectus, which in respect of any subsequent issue of Notes to be listed and admitted to trading on Euronext Paris or on a Regulated Market of a Member State of the European Economic Area, shall constitute a supplement to the Base Prospectus for the purpose of the relevant provisions of the Prospectus Directive. If a supplement is produced pursuant to the provisions of Article 16 of the Prospectus Directive and Article 212-25 of the *Règlement Général* of the AMF, and if prospective investors have already agreed to subscribe for the Notes which relate to an offer of Notes to the public, such investors shall have the right, exercisable within two working days after the publication of the supplement, to withdraw their acceptances.

# FORMS OF THE NOTES AND TRANSFER RESTRICTIONS RELATING TO U.S. SALES

#### **Bearer Notes**

Each Tranche of Bearer Notes will initially be in the form of either a temporary global note (the "**Temporary Global Note**"), without interest coupons, or a permanent global note (the "**Permanent Global Note**"), without interest coupons, in each case as specified in the relevant Final Terms. Each Temporary Global Note or, as the case may be, Permanent Global Note which is intended to be issued in CGN form, as specified in the applicable Final Terms, will be delivered to a common depositary for Euroclear and/or Clearstream, Luxembourg and each Temporary Global Note or, as the case may be, Permanent Global Note or, as the case may be, Permanent Global Note or, as the case may be, Permanent Global Note which is intended to be issued in NGN form, as specified in the applicable Final Terms, will delivered to a common safekeeper for Euroclear and/or Clearstream, Luxembourg.

The relevant Final Terms will also specify whether United States Treasury Regulation 1.163-5(c)(2)(i)(C) (the "**TEFRA C Rules**") or United States Treasury Regulation 1.163-5(c)(2)(i)(D) (the "**TEFRA D Rules**") are applicable in relation to the Notes or, if the Notes do not have a maturity of more than 365 days, that neither the TEFRA C Rules nor the TEFRA D Rules are applicable.

#### Temporary Global Note exchangeable for Permanent Global Note

If the relevant Final Terms specify the form of Notes as being "Temporary Global Note exchangeable for a Permanent Global Note which is exchangeable for Definitive Notes, in the limited circumstances specified in the Permanent Global Note", then the Notes will initially be in the form of a Temporary Global Note which will be exchangeable, in whole or in part, for interests in a Permanent Global Note, without interest coupons, not earlier than 40 calendar days after the issue date of the relevant Tranche of the Notes upon certification as to non-U.S. beneficial ownership. No payments will be made under the Temporary Global Note unless exchange for interests in the Permanent Global Note is improperly withheld or refused. In addition, interest payments in respect of the Notes cannot be collected without such certification of non-U.S. beneficial ownership.

Whenever any interest in the Temporary Global Note is to be exchanged for an interest in a Permanent Global Note, the Issuer shall procure (in the case of first exchange) the prompt delivery (free of charge to the bearer) of such Permanent Global Note, duly authenticated and, in the case of a NGN, effectuated, to the bearer of the Temporary Global Note or (in the case of any subsequent exchange) an increase in the principal amount of the Permanent Global Note in accordance with its terms against

- (i) presentation and (in the case of final exchange) surrender of the Temporary Global Note at the Specified Office of the Fiscal Agent; and
- (ii) receipt by the Fiscal Agent of a certificate or certificates of non-U.S. beneficial ownership,

within seven calendar days of the bearer requesting such exchange.

The principal amount of the Permanent Global Note shall be equal to the aggregate of the principal amounts specified in the certificates of non-U.S. beneficial ownership; *provided, however*, that in no circumstances shall the principal amount of the Permanent Global Note exceed the initial principal amount of the Temporary Global Note.

The Permanent Global Note will be exchangeable in whole, but not in part, for Notes in definitive form ("**Definitive Notes**") if, (a) Euroclear or Clearstream, Luxembourg or any other relevant clearing system is closed for business for a continuous period of 14 days (other than by reason of legal holidays) or announces an intention permanently to cease business or, (b) any of the circumstances described in Condition 14 (*Events of Default*) occurs, or, (c) if, by reason of any change in the laws of France, the Issuer is or will be required to make any withholding or deduction from any payment in respect of the Notes which would not be required if the Notes were in definitive form.

Whenever the Permanent Global Note is to be exchanged for Definitive Notes, the Issuer shall procure the prompt delivery (free of charge to the bearer) of such Definitive Notes, duly authenticated and with Coupons and Talons attached (if so specified in the relevant Final Terms), in an aggregate principal amount equal to the principal amount of the Permanent Global Note to the bearer of the Permanent Global Note against the surrender of the Permanent Global Note at the Specified Office of the Fiscal Agent within 30 calendar days of the bearer requesting such exchange.

## Temporary Global Note exchangeable for Definitive Notes

If the relevant Final Terms specify the form of Notes as being "Temporary Global Note exchangeable for Definitive Notes" and also specify that the TEFRA C Rules are applicable or that neither the TEFRA C Rules or the TEFRA D Rules are applicable, then the Notes will initially be in the form of a Temporary Global Note which will be exchangeable, in whole but not in part, for Definitive Notes not earlier than 40 calendar days after the issue date of the relevant Tranche of the Notes.

If the relevant Final Terms specify the form of Notes as being "Temporary Global Note exchangeable for Definitive Notes in the limited circumstances specified in the Permanent Global Note" and also specify that the TEFRA D Rules are applicable, then the Notes will initially be in the form of a Temporary Global Note which will be exchangeable, in whole or in part, for Definitive Notes not earlier than 40 calendar days after the issue date of the relevant Tranche of the Notes upon certification as to non-U.S. beneficial ownership. Interest payments in respect of the Notes cannot be collected without such certification of non-U.S. beneficial ownership.

Whenever the Temporary Global Note is to be exchanged for Definitive Notes, the Issuer shall procure the prompt delivery (free of charge to the bearer) of such Definitive Notes, duly authenticated and with Coupons and Talons attached (if so specified in the relevant Final Terms), in an aggregate principal amount equal to the principal amount of the Temporary Global Note to the bearer of the Temporary Global Note against the surrender of the Temporary Global Note at the Specified Office of the Fiscal Agent within 30 calendar days of the bearer requesting such exchange.

## Permanent Global Note exchangeable for Definitive Notes

If the relevant Final Terms specify the form of Notes as being "Permanent Global Note exchangeable for Definitive Notes", then the Notes will initially be in the form of a Permanent Global Note which will be exchangeable in whole, but not in part, for Definitive Notes if (a) Euroclear or Clearstream, Luxembourg or any other relevant clearing system is closed for business for a continuous period of 14 days (other than by reason of legal holidays) or announces an intention permanently to cease business, or (b) any of the circumstances described in Condition 14 (*Events of Default*) occurs, or (c) if, by reason of any change in the laws of France, the Issuer is or will be required to make any withholding or deduction from any payment in respect of the Notes which would not be required if the Notes were in definitive form.

Whenever the Permanent Global Note is to be exchanged for Definitive Notes, the Issuer shall procure the prompt delivery (free of charge to the bearer) of such Definitive Notes, duly authenticated and with Coupons and Talons attached (if so specified in the relevant Final Terms), in an aggregate principal amount equal to the principal amount of the Permanent Global Note to the bearer of the Permanent Global Note at the Specified Office of the Fiscal Agent within 30 calendar days of the bearer requesting such exchange.

## **Clearing System Accountholders**

Each Global Note will be in bearer form. Consequently, in relation to any Tranche of Notes represented by a Global Note, references in the Terms and Conditions of the Notes to "**Noteholder**" are references to the bearer of the relevant Global Note which, for so long as the Global Note is held by a depositary or a common depositary in the case of a CGN, or a common safekeeper, in the case of an NGN for Euroclear and/or Clearstream, Luxembourg and/or any other relevant clearing system, will be that depositary or common depositary, or as the case may be, common safekeeper.

Each of the persons shown in the records of Euroclear and/or Clearstream, Luxembourg and/or any other relevant clearing system as being entitled to an interest in a Global Note (each an "Accountholder") must look solely to Euroclear and/or Clearstream, Luxembourg and/or such other relevant clearing system (as the case may be) for such Accountholder's share of each payment made by the Issuer to the bearer of such Global Note and in relation to all other rights arising under the Global Note. The extent to which, and the manner in which, Accountholders may exercise any rights arising under the Global Note will be determined by the respective rules and procedures of Euroclear and Clearstream, Luxembourg and any other relevant clearing system from time to time. For so long as the relevant Notes are represented by the Global Note, Accountholders shall have no claim directly against the Issuer in respect of payments due under the Notes and such obligations of the Issuer will be discharged by payment to the bearer of the Global Note.

# **Exchange of Temporary Global Notes**

Whenever any interest in a Temporary Global Note is to be exchanged for an interest in a Permanent Global Note, the Issuer shall procure:

- (a) in the case of first exchange, the prompt delivery (free of charge to the bearer) of such Permanent Global Note, duly authenticated, to the bearer of the Temporary Global Note; or
- (b) in the case of any subsequent exchange, an increase in the principal amount of such Permanent Global Note in accordance with its terms,

in each case in an aggregate principal amount equal to the aggregate of the principal amounts specified in the certificates issued by Euroclear and/or Clearstream, Luxembourg and/or any other relevant clearing system and received by the Fiscal Agent against presentation and (in the case of final exchange) surrender of the Temporary Global Note at the Specified Office of the Fiscal Agent within seven calendar days of the bearer requesting such exchange.

Whenever a Temporary Global Note is to be exchanged for Definitive Notes, the Issuer shall procure the prompt delivery (free of charge to the bearer) of such Definitive Notes, duly authenticated and with Coupons and Talons attached (if so specified in the relevant Final Terms), in an aggregate principal amount equal to the principal amount of the Temporary Global Note to the bearer of the Temporary Global Note at the Specified Office of the Fiscal Agent within 30 calendar days of the bearer requesting such exchange.

If:

- (a) a Permanent Global Note has not been delivered or the principal amount thereof increased by 5.00 p.m. (London time) on the seventh day after the bearer of a Temporary Global Note has requested exchange of an interest in the Temporary Global Note for an interest in a Permanent Global Note; or
- (b) Definitive Notes have not been delivered by 5.00 p.m. (London time) on the thirtieth day after the bearer of a Temporary Global Note has requested exchange of the Temporary Global Note for Definitive Notes; or
- (c) a Temporary Global Note (or any part thereof) has become due and payable in accordance with the Terms and Conditions of the Notes or the date for final redemption of a Temporary Global Note has occurred and, in either case, payment in full of the amount of principal falling due with all accrued interest thereon has not been made to the bearer of the Temporary Global Note in accordance with the terms of the Temporary Global Note on the due date for payment,

then the Temporary Global Note (including the obligation to deliver a Permanent Global Note or increase the principal amount thereof or deliver Definitive Notes, as the case may be) will become void at 5.00 p.m. (London time) on such seventh day (in the case of (a) above) or at 5.00 p.m. (London time) on such thirtieth day (in the case of (b) above) or at 5.00 p.m. (London time) on such due date (in the case of (c) above) and the bearer of the Temporary Global Note will have no further rights thereunder (but without prejudice to the rights which the bearer of the Temporary Global Note or others may have under the Deed of Covenant executed by the Issuer). Under the Deed of Covenant, persons shown in the records of Euroclear and/or Clearstream, Luxembourg and/or any other relevant clearing system as being entitled to an interest in a Temporary Global Note will acquire directly against the Issuer all those rights to which they would have been entitled if, immediately before the Temporary Global Note became void, they had been the holders of Definitive Notes in an aggregate principal amount equal to the principal amount of Notes they were shown as holding in the records of Euroclear and/or Clearstream, Luxembourg and/or any other relevant clearing system.

## **Exchange of Permanent Global Notes**

Whenever a Permanent Global Note is to be exchanged for Definitive Notes such exchange may only be made in full. In such a case, the Issuer shall procure the prompt delivery (free of charge to the bearer) of the Definitive Notes, duly authenticated and with Coupons and Talons attached (if so specified in the relevant Final Terms), in an aggregate principal amount equal to the principal amount of the Permanent Global Note to the bearer of the Permanent Global Note against the surrender of the Permanent Global Note at the Specified Office of the Fiscal Agent within 30 calendar days of the bearer requesting such exchange.

- If:
- (a) Definitive Notes have not been delivered by 5.00 p.m. (London time) on the thirtieth day after the bearer of a Permanent Global Note has duly requested exchange of the Permanent Global Note for Definitive Notes; or
- (b) a Permanent Global Note (or any part of it) has become due and payable in accordance with the Terms and Conditions of the Notes or the date for final redemption of the Notes has occurred and, in either case, payment in full of the amount of principal falling due with all accrued interest thereon has not been made to the bearer of the Permanent Global Note in accordance with the terms of the Permanent Global Note on the due date for payment,

then the Permanent Global Note (including the obligation to deliver Definitive Notes) will become void at 5.00 p.m. (London time) on such thirtieth day (in the case of (a) above) or at 5.00 p.m. (London time) on such due date (in the case of (b) above) and the bearer of the Permanent Global Note will have no further rights thereunder (but without prejudice to the rights which the bearer of the Permanent Global Note or others may have under the Deed of Covenant). Under the Deed of Covenant, persons shown in the records of Euroclear and/or Clearstream, Luxembourg and/or any other relevant clearing system as being entitled to an interest in a Permanent Global Note will acquire directly against the Issuer all those rights to which they would have been entitled if, immediately before the Permanent Global Note became void, they had been the holders of Definitive Notes in an aggregate principal amount equal to the principal amount of Notes they were shown as holding in the records of Euroclear and/or Clearstream, Luxembourg and/or any other relevant clearing system.

# **Registered Notes**

Each Tranche of Registered Notes will be represented by (i) interests in an Unrestricted Global Note Certificate (in the case of Notes sold outside the United States in reliance on Regulation S under the Securities Act) ("**Unrestricted Notes**") or (ii) interests in a Restricted Global Note Certificate (in the case of Notes sold in reliance on Rule 144A under the Securities Act) ("**Restricted Notes**").

Each Unrestricted Global Note Certificate will be registered in the name of Cede & Co. (or such other entity as is specified in the applicable Final Terms) as nominee for DTC and will be deposited on or about the relevant issue date with the custodian for DTC (the "**DTC Custodian**") specified in the applicable Final Terms (for the accounts of Euroclear and Clearstream, Luxembourg).

Each Restricted Global Note Certificate will be registered in the name of Cede & Co. (or such other entity as is specified in the applicable Final Terms) as nominee for DTC and will be deposited on or about the issue date with the DTC Custodian as custodian for DTC. The Restricted Global Note Certificate (and any Individual Note Certificates issued in exchange therefor) will be subject to certain restrictions on transfer as described below under "Transfer Restrictions".

# **Transfer Restrictions**

On or prior to the fortieth day after the relevant issue date, Notes represented by an interest in an Unrestricted Global Note Certificate may be transferred to a person who wishes to hold such Notes in the form of an interest in a Restricted Global Note Certificate only upon receipt by the Registrar of a written certification from the transferor (in the form set out in Schedule 4 (*Form of Transfer Certificate*) to the Agency Agreement) to the effect that such transfer is being made to a person whom the transferor reasonably believes is a qualified institutional buyer within the meaning of Rule 144A, in a transaction meeting the requirements of Rule 144A and in accordance with any applicable securities laws of any state of the United States. After such fortieth day, such certification requirements will no longer apply to such transfers, but such transfers will continue to be subject to the transfer restrictions contained in the legend appearing on the face of such Global Note Certificates".

Notes represented by an interest in a Restricted Global Note Certificate may also be transferred to a person who wishes to hold such Notes in the form of an interest through an Unrestricted Global Note Certificate, but only upon receipt by the Registrar of a written certification from the transferor (in the relevant form set out in Schedule 5 or 6 (as applicable) (*Form of Transfer Certificate*) to the Agency Agreement) to the effect that such transfer is being made in accordance with Regulation S or Rule 144 (if available) under the Securities Act.

Transfer restrictions will terminate three years after the relevant issue date provided that any Notes purchased by or on behalf of the Issuer or any of its affiliates have been cancelled in accordance with Condition 11(i) (*Redemption and Purchase – Cancellation*).

Any interest in either a Restricted Global Note Certificate or an Unrestricted Global Note Certificate that is transferred to a person who takes delivery in the form of an interest in the other Global Note Certificate will, upon transfer, cease to be an interest in such Global Note Certificate and become an interest in the other Global Note Certificate and, accordingly, will thereafter be subject to all transfer restrictions and other procedures applicable to an interest in such other Global Note Certificate.

The Notes are being offered and sold in the United States only to qualified institutional buyers within the meaning of and in reliance on Rule 144A.

Each purchaser of Notes offered pursuant to Rule 144A will be deemed to have represented and agreed as follows (terms used in the following paragraphs that are defined in Rule 144A have the respective meanings given to them in Rule 144A):

- (a) the purchaser (i) is a qualified institutional buyer, (ii) is acquiring the Notes for its own account or for the account of such a qualified institutional buyer and (iii) is aware that the sale of the Notes to it is being made in reliance on Rule 144A;
- (b) the purchaser understands that the Notes are being offered only in a transaction not involving any public offering in the United States within the meaning of the Securities Act and that the Notes have not been and will not be registered under the Securities Act and may not be reoffered, resold, pledged or otherwise transferred except in accordance with the legend set forth below; and
- (c) the purchaser understands that the Restricted Global Note Certificate and any Restricted Individual Note Certificates (as defined below) will bear a legend to the following effect, unless the Issuer determines otherwise in accordance with applicable law:

THE NOTES REPRESENTED HEREBY HAVE NOT BEEN AND WILL NOT BE REGISTERED UNDER THE UNITED STATES SECURITIES ACT OF 1933 (THE "SECURITIES ACT") OR ANY SECURITIES LAW OF ANY STATE OF THE UNITED STATES. THE HOLDER HEREOF, BY PURCHASING THE NOTES REPRESENTED HEREBY, AGREES FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE ISSUER THAT THE NOTES REPRESENTED HEREBY MAY BE REOFFERED, RESOLD, PLEDGED OR OTHERWISE TRANSFERRED ONLY IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE SECURITIES ACT AND OTHER APPLICABLE LAWS AND ONLY (1) PURSUANT TO RULE 144A UNDER THE SECURITIES ACT TO A PERSON THAT THE HOLDER REASONABLY BELIEVES IS A OUALIFIED INSTITUTIONAL BUYER WITHIN THE MEANING OF RULE 144A PURCHASING FOR ITS OWN ACCOUNT OR A PERSON PURCHASING FOR THE ACCOUNT OF A QUALIFIED INSTITUTIONAL BUYER WHOM THE HOLDER HAS INFORMED, IN EACH CASE, THAT THE REOFFER, RESALE, PLEDGE OR OTHER TRANSFER IS BEING MADE IN RELIANCE ON RULE 144A, (2) IN AN OFFSHORE TRANSACTION IN ACCORDANCE WITH RULE 903 OR 904 OF REGULATION S UNDER THE SECURITIES ACT, (3) PURSUANT TO AN EXEMPTION FROM REGISTRATION PROVIDED BY RULE 144 UNDER THE SECURITIES ACT (IF AVAILABLE) OR (4) TO THE ISSUER OR ITS AFFILIATES.

Upon the transfer, exchange or replacement of a Restricted Global Note Certificate or a Restricted Individual Note Certificate bearing the above legend, or upon specific request for removal of the legend, the Issuer will deliver only Individual Note Certificates that bear such legend ("**Restricted Individual Note Certificates**") or will refuse to remove such legend, unless there is delivered to the Issuer and the Registrar such satisfactory evidence (which may include a legal opinion) as may reasonably be required by the Issuer that neither the legend nor the restrictions on transfer set forth therein are required to ensure compliance with the provisions of the Securities Act. Such transfer restrictions will terminate three years after the relevant issue date provided that any Notes purchased by or on behalf of the Issuer or any of its respective affiliates have been cancelled in accordance with Condition 11(i) (*Redemption and Purchase – Cancellation*).

## Exchange of Interests in Global Note Certificates for Individual Note Certificates

Registration of title to Notes initially represented by the Global Note Certificates in a name other than DTC or a successor depositary or one of their respective nominees will not be permitted unless:

(a) such depositary notifies the Issuer that it is no longer willing or able to discharge properly its responsibilities as depositary with respect to the relevant Global Note Certificate or ceases to be a clearing agency (as defined in the Exchange Act), or is at any time no longer eligible to act as such, and the Issuer is (in the case of it ceasing to be depositary) unable to locate a qualified successor within 90 calendar days of receiving notice of such ineligibility on the part of such depositary; or

- (b) any of the circumstances described in Condition 14 (Events of Default) occurs; or
- (c) (in the case of the Unrestricted Global Note Certificate only) Euroclear or Clearstream, Luxembourg is closed for a continuous period of 14 days (other than by reason of legal holidays) or announces an intention permanently to cease business.

In such circumstances, the Issuer shall procure the delivery of Individual Note Certificates in exchange for the Unrestricted Global Note Certificate and/or the Restricted Global Note Certificate. A person having an interest in a Global Note Certificate must provide the Registrar (through DTC, Euroclear and/or Clearstream, Luxembourg) with (a) such information as the Issuer and the Registrar may require to complete and deliver Individual Note Certificates (including the name and address of each person in which the Individual Note Certificates are to be registered and the principal amount of each such person's holding) and (b) (in the case of the Restricted Global Note Certificate only) a certificate given by or on behalf of the holder of each beneficial interest in the Restricted Global Note Certificate stating either (i) that such holder is not transferring its interest at the time of such exchange or (ii) that the transfer or exchange of such interest has been made in compliance with the transfer restrictions applicable to the Notes and that the person transferring such interest reasonably believes that the person acquiring such interest is a qualified institutional buyer and is obtaining such beneficial interest in a transaction meeting the requirements of Rule 144A. Individual Note Certificates issued in exchange for interests in the Restricted Global Note Certificate will bear the legends and be subject to the transfer restrictions set out above under "Transfer Restrictions". Such transfer restrictions will terminate three years after the relevant issue date, provided that any Notes purchased by or on behalf of the Issuer or any of its affiliates have been cancelled in accordance with Condition 11(i) (Redemption and Purchase - Cancellation).

Whenever a Global Note Certificate is to be exchanged for Individual Note Certificates, such Individual Note Certificates will be issued within five business days of the delivery to the Registrar of the information and any required certification described in the preceding paragraph against the surrender of the relevant Global Note Certificate at the Specified Office of the Registrar. Such exchange shall be effected in accordance with the regulations concerning the transfer and registration from time to time relating to the Notes and shall be effected without charge, but against such indemnity as the Registrar may require in respect of any tax or other duty of whatsoever nature which may be levied or imposed in connection with such exchange.

If (a) Individual Note Certificates have not been delivered by 5.00 p.m. (London time) on the thirtieth day after the due date for their delivery in exchange for interests in a Global Note Certificate or (b) any of the Notes represented by a Global Note Certificate has become due and payable in accordance with the Conditions or the date for final redemption of the Notes has occurred and, in either case, payment in full of the amount of principal falling due with all accrued interest thereon has not been made to the registered Holder of such Global Note Certificate in accordance with its terms on the due date for payment, then such Global Note Certificate (including the obligation to deliver Individual Note Certificates) will become void at 5.00 p.m. (London time) on such thirtieth day (in the case of (a) above) or at 5.00 p.m. (London time) on such due date (in the case of (b) above) and the registered Holder will have no further rights under such Global Note Certificate (but without prejudice to the rights which the Holder of the Notes represented by such Global Note Certificate or others may have under the Deed of Covenant executed by the Issuer). Under the Deed of Covenant, persons shown in the records of DTC, Euroclear and/or Clearstream, Luxembourg as being entitled to an interest in the Notes represented by a Global Note Certificate will acquire directly against the Issuer all those rights to which they would have been entitled if, immediately before such Global Note Certificate became void, they had been the registered Holders of Notes represented by Individual Note Certificates in an aggregate principal amount equal to the principal amount of Notes they were shown as holding in the records of DTC, Euroclear and/or (as the case may be) Clearstream, Luxembourg.

The Registrar will not register the transfer of or exchange of interests in a Global Note Certificate for Individual Note Certificates for a period of 15 calendar days ending on the due date for any payment of principal or interest in respect of the Notes.

# DTC Book-Entry Ownership of Global Note Certificates

The Issuer will make an application to DTC, Euroclear and Clearstream, Luxembourg for acceptance in their respective book-entry settlement systems of each Tranche of Unrestricted Notes. The Unrestricted Notes will have a CINS number, a common code and an ISIN. The Issuer will also make an application to DTC for acceptance in its book-entry settlement system of each Tranche of Restricted Notes. The Restricted Notes will have a CUSIP number.

The DTC Custodian and DTC will record electronically the principal amount of the Notes represented by an Unrestricted Global Note Certificate and a Restricted Global Note Certificate held within the DTC system. Up to and including the fortieth day after the later of the commencement of the offering and the relevant issue date,

investors may hold their interests in an Unrestricted Global Note Certificate only through Clearstream, Luxembourg or Euroclear. Thereafter, investors may additionally hold such interests directly through DTC, if they are participants in DTC, or indirectly through organisations which are participants in DTC. Clearstream, Luxembourg and Euroclear will hold interests in the Unrestricted Global Note Certificate on behalf of their account holders through customers' securities accounts in Clearstream, Luxembourg's or Euroclear's respective names on the books of their respective depositaries, which in turn will hold such interests in the Unrestricted Global Note Certificate in customers' securities accounts in the depositaries' names on the books of DTC. Investors may hold their interests in the Restricted Global Note Certificate directly through DTC, if they are participants in DTC, or indirectly through organisations which are participants in DTC.

Payments of the principal of, interest on and any other amounts payable under each Global Note Certificate registered in the name of DTC's nominee will be made to or to the order of its nominee as the registered Holder of such Global Note Certificate. The Issuer expects that the nominee, upon receipt of any such payment, will immediately credit DTC participants' accounts with payments in amounts proportionate to their respective interests in the principal amount of the relevant Global Note Certificate as shown on the records of DTC or the nominee. The Issuer also expects that payments by DTC participants to owners of interests in such Global Note Certificate held through such DTC participants will be governed by standing instructions and customary practices, as is now the case with securities held for the accounts of customers registered in the names of nominees for such customers. Such payments will be the responsibility of such DTC participants. None of the Issuer, the Registrar, any Transfer Agent or any Paying Agent will have any responsibility or liability for any aspect of the records relating to or payments made on account of ownership interests in the Global Note Certificates or for maintaining, supervising or reviewing any records relating to such ownership interests.

While a Global Note Certificate is lodged with DTC or its custodian, Notes represented by Individual Note Certificates will not be eligible for clearing or settlement through DTC, Clearstream, Luxembourg or Euroclear.

## **Transfers of Interests in Global Note Certificates**

Transfers of interests in Global Note Certificates within DTC, Euroclear and Clearstream, Luxembourg will be in accordance with the usual rules and operating procedures of the relevant clearing system.

The laws of some states of the United States require that certain persons receive individual certificates in respect of their holdings of Notes. Consequently, the ability to transfer interests in a Global Note Certificate to such persons will be limited. Because DTC only acts on behalf of participants, who in turn act on behalf of indirect participants, the ability of a person having an interest in a Global Note Certificate to pledge such interest to persons or entities which do not participate in the relevant clearing system, or otherwise take actions in respect of such interest, may be affected by the lack of an Individual Note Certificate representing such interest.

Subject to compliance with the transfer restrictions applicable to the Notes described above and under "Subscription and Sale", cross-market transfers between DTC participants, on the one hand, and Clearstream, Luxembourg or Euroclear account holders, on the other, will be effected in DTC in accordance with DTC rules and procedures and on behalf of Clearstream, Luxembourg or (as the case may be) Euroclear by its respective depositary. However, such cross-market transactions will require delivery of instructions to Clearstream, Luxembourg or (as the case may be) Euroclear by the counterparty in such system in accordance with its rules and procedures and within its established deadlines. Clearstream, Luxembourg or (as the case may be) Euroclear will, if the transaction meets its settlement requirements, deliver instructions to its respective depositary to take action to effect final settlement on its behalf by delivering or receiving beneficial interests in the relevant Global Note Certificate in DTC, and making or receiving payment in accordance with normal procedures for same-day funds settlement applicable to DTC. Clearstream, Luxembourg account holders and Euroclear account holders may not deliver instructions directly to the depositaries for Clearstream, Luxembourg or Euroclear.

Because of time zone differences, credits of Notes received in Clearstream, Luxembourg or Euroclear as a result of a transaction with a DTC participant will be made during the securities settlement processing day dated the business day following the DTC settlement date and such credits of any transactions in such securities settled during such processing will be reported to the relevant Clearstream, Luxembourg or Euroclear account holder on such business day. Cash received in Clearstream, Luxembourg or Euroclear as a result of sales of Notes by or through a Clearstream, Luxembourg account holder or a Euroclear account holder to a DTC participant will be received with value on the DTC settlement date but will be available in the relevant Clearstream, Luxembourg or Euroclear cash account only as of the business day following settlement in DTC. Settlement between Euroclear or Clearstream, Luxembourg account holders and DTC participants cannot be made on a delivery versus payment basis. The arrangements for transfer of payments must be established separately from the arrangements for transfer of Notes, the latter being effected on a free delivery basis. The customary arrangements for delivery versus payment between Euroclear and Clearstream, Luxembourg account holders or between DTC participants are not affected.

For a further description of restrictions on the transfer of Notes, see "Subscription and Sale".

DTC has advised the Issuer that it will take any action permitted to be taken by a holder of Notes (including, without limitation, the presentation of Global Note Certificates for exchange as described above) only at the direction of one or more participants in whose account with DTC interests in Global Note Certificates are credited, and only in respect of such portion of the aggregate principal amount of the Global Note Certificates as to which such participant or participants has or have given such direction. However, in certain circumstances, DTC will exchange the Global Note Certificates for Individual Note Certificates (which will, in the case of Restricted Notes, bear the legend set out above under "**Transfer Restrictions**").

Although DTC, Clearstream, Luxembourg and Euroclear have agreed to the foregoing procedures in order to facilitate transfers of interests in the Global Note Certificates among participants and account holders of DTC, Clearstream, Luxembourg and Euroclear, they are under no obligation to perform or continue to perform such procedures, and such procedures may be discontinued at any time. None of the Issuer, the Registrar, any Transfer Agent and any Paying Agent will have any responsibility for the performance by DTC, Clearstream, Luxembourg or Euroclear or their respective direct or indirect participants or account holders of their respective obligations under the rules and procedures governing their respective operations.

## Terms and Conditions applicable to the Notes

The terms and conditions applicable to any Definitive Note will be endorsed on that Note and will consist of the terms and conditions set out under "Terms and Conditions of the Notes" below and the provisions of the relevant Final Terms which complete those terms and conditions.

## **Conditions applicable to Global Notes**

Each Global Note will contain provisions which modify the Terms and Conditions of the Notes as they apply to the Global Note. The following is a summary of certain of those provisions:

*Payments:* All payments in respect of the Global Note will be made against presentation and (in the case of payment of principal in full with all interest accrued thereon) surrender of the Global Note at the Specified Office of any Paying Agent and will be effective to satisfy and discharge the corresponding liabilities of the Issuer in respect of the Notes. On each occasion on which a payment of principal or interest is made in respect of the Global Note, the Issuer shall procure that in respect of a CGN the payment is noted in a schedule thereto and in respect of an NGN the payment is entered pro rata in the records of Euroclear and Clearstream, Luxembourg.

*Payment Business Day*: Notwithstanding the definition of "Payment Business Day" in the Terms and Conditions of the Notes, while all Notes are represented by a Global Note the definition, of "Payment Business Day" means:

- (i) if the currency of payment is euro, any day which is in the case of payment by transfer to an account, a TARGET2 Settlement Day and a day on which dealings in foreign currencies may be carried on in each (if any) Additional Financial Centre; or
- (ii) if the currency of payment is not euro, any day which is in the case of payment by transfer to an account, a day on which dealings in foreign currencies may be carried on in the Principal Financial Centre of the currency of payment and in each (if any) Additional Financial Centre.

*Exercise of put option:* In order to exercise the option contained in Condition 11(e) (*Redemption at the option of Noteholders*) the bearer of the Permanent Global Note must, within the period specified in the Conditions for the deposit of the relevant Note and put notice, give written notice of such exercise to the Fiscal Agent specifying the principal amount of Notes in respect of which such option is being exercised. Any such notice will be irrevocable and may not be withdrawn.

*Partial exercise of call option:* In connection with an exercise of the option contained in Condition 11(c) (*Redemption at the option of the Issuer*) in relation to some only of the Notes, the Permanent Global Note may be redeemed in part in the principal amount specified by the Issuer in accordance with the Conditions and the Notes to be redeemed will not be selected as provided in the Conditions. For so long as any of the Notes are represented by a Global Note, no selection of Notes by lot will be required under Condition 11(c) in the event that the Issuer exercises any option thereunder. In such event the standard procedures of the ICSD (as defined in the Agency Agreement) shall operate to determine which interests in a Global Note are to be subject to such

option and such redemption shall be reflected in the records of Euroclear and/or Clearstream, Luxembourg as either a pool factor or a reduction in nominal amount, at their discretion.

*Notices:* Notwithstanding Condition 20 (*Notices*), while all the Notes are represented by a Permanent Global Note (or by a Permanent Global Note and/or a Temporary Global Note) and the Permanent Global Note is (or the Permanent Global Note and/or the Temporary Global Note are) deposited with a depositary or a common depositary for Euroclear and/or Clearstream, Luxembourg and/or any other relevant clearing system, notices to Noteholders may be given by delivery of the relevant notice to Euroclear and/or Clearstream, Luxembourg and/or any other relevant clearing system and, in any case, such notices shall be deemed to have been given to the Noteholders in accordance with Condition 20 (*Notices*) on the date of delivery to Euroclear and/or Clearstream, Luxembourg and/or any other relevant clearing system.

In such circumstances, notices may be given by any Noteholder to the Fiscal Agent (or, in the case of Global Note Certificates, the Registrar) through Euroclear and/or Clearstream, Luxembourg and/or any other relevant clearing system in such manner as the Fiscal Agent or the Registrar, as the case may be, and/or Euroclear and/or Clearstream, Luxembourg and/or any other relevant clearing system may approve for this purpose.

*Redenomination:* If the Notes are redenominated pursuant to Condition 23 (*Redenomination, Renominalisation and Reconventioning*), then following redenomination:

- (a) if Definitive Notes are required to be issued, they shall be issued at the expense of the Issuer in the denominations of euro 0.01, euro 1,000, euro 10,000, euro 100,000 and such other denominations as the Fiscal Agent shall determine and notify to the Noteholders; and
- (b) the amount of interest due in respect of Notes represented by a Permanent Global Note and/or a Temporary Global Note will be calculated by reference to the aggregate principal amount of such Notes and the amount of such payment shall be rounded down to the nearest euro 0.01.

Notwithstanding the provisions of Condition 12 'Payments under Registered Notes' (a) in respect of registered notes represented by a Global Note, the definition of "Record Date" will be one business day before the due date for any such payment.

## Legend concerning United States persons

In the case of any Tranche of Bearer Notes having a maturity of more than 365 days, the Notes in global form, the Notes in definitive form and any Coupons and Talons appertaining thereto will bear a legend to the following effect:

"Any United States person who holds this obligation will be subject to limitations under the United States income tax laws, including the limitations provided in Sections 165(j) and 1287(a) of the Internal Revenue Code."

The sections referred to in such legend provide that a United States person who holds a Note, Coupon or Talon will generally not be allowed to deduct any loss realised on the sale, exchange or redemption of such Note, Coupon or Talon and any gain (which might otherwise be characterised as capital gain) recognised on such sale, exchange or redemption will be treated as ordinary income.

# TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE NOTES

The following is the text of the terms and conditions which, subject to completion by the relevant Final Terms, will be endorsed on each Note in definitive form issued under the Programme. The terms and conditions applicable to any Note in global form will differ from those terms and conditions which would apply to the Note were it in definitive form to the extent described under "Forms of the Notes and Transfer Restrictions relating to U.S. Sales" above.

## 1. Introduction

- (a) *Programme:* Thales (the "**Issuer**") has established a Global Medium Term Note Programme (the "**Programme**") for the issuance of up to €3,000,000,000 in aggregate principal amount of notes (the "**Notes**").
- (b) Final Terms: Notes issued under the Programme are issued in series (each a "Series") and each Series may comprise one or more tranches (each a "Tranche") of Notes. Each Tranche is the subject of final terms (the "Final Terms") which completes these terms and conditions (the "Conditions"). The terms and conditions applicable to any particular Tranche of Notes are these Conditions subject to completion by the relevant Final Terms. In the event of any inconsistency between these Conditions and the relevant Final Terms, the relevant Final Terms shall prevail.
- (c) Agency Agreement: The Notes are the subject of an amended and restated fiscal agency agreement dated 29 October 2013 (as amended or supplemented from time to time, the "Agency Agreement") between the Issuer, BNP Paribas Securities Services, Luxembourg Branch as fiscal agent (the "Fiscal Agent", which expression includes any successor fiscal agent appointed from time to time in connection with the Notes), BNP Paribas Securities Services, Luxembourg Branch as registrar (the "Registrar", which expression includes any successor registrar appointed from time to time in connection with the Notes) and the transfer and paying agents named therein (together with the Fiscal Agent and the Registrar, the "Agents", which expression includes any successor or additional agents appointed from time to time in connection with the Notes).
- (d) The Notes: All subsequent references in these Conditions to "Notes" are to the Notes which are the subject of the relevant Final Terms. Copies of the relevant Final Terms are available by Noteholders during normal business hours at the Specified Office of the Fiscal Agent or, in the case of Registered Notes (as defined in Condition 2) the Registrar, the initial Specified Office of which is set out below.
- (e) Summaries: Certain provisions of these Conditions are summaries of the Agency Agreement and are subject to its detailed provisions. Noteholders and Couponholders, if any, are bound by, and are deemed to have notice of, all the provisions of the Agency Agreement applicable to them. Copies of the Agency Agreement are available for inspection by Noteholders during normal business hours at the Specified Offices of each of the Paying Agents, the initial Specified Offices of which are set out below.

# 2. Interpretation

(a) *Definitions:* In these Conditions the following expressions have the following meanings:

"Accrual Yield" has the meaning given in the relevant Final Terms;

"Additional Business Centre(s)" means the city or cities specified as such in the relevant Final Terms;

"Additional Financial Centre(s)" means the city or cities specified as such in the relevant Final Terms;

"Bearer Note" means a Note in bearer form;

"Business Day" means:

- (i) in relation to any sum payable in euro, a TARGET2 Settlement Day and a day on which commercial banks and foreign exchange markets settle payments generally in each (if any) Additional Business Centre; and
- (ii) in relation to any sum payable in a currency other than euro, a day on which commercial banks and foreign exchange markets settle payments generally in London, in the Principal Financial Centre of the relevant currency and in each (if any) Additional Business Centre;

"**Business Day Convention**", in relation to any particular date, has the meaning given in the relevant Final Terms and, if so specified in the relevant Final Terms, may have different meanings in relation to different dates and, in this context, the following expressions shall have the following meanings:

- (i) **"Following Business Day Convention**" means that the relevant date shall be postponed to the first following day that is a Business Day;
- (ii) "Modified Following Business Day Convention" means that the relevant date shall be postponed to the next day which is a Business Day unless it would thereby fall into the next calendar month in which event that date shall be brought forward to the immediately preceding Business Day;
- (iii) "**Preceding Business Day Convention**" means that the relevant date shall be brought forward to the first preceding day that is a Business Day;
- (iv) "FRN Convention", "Floating Rate Convention" or "Eurodollar Convention" means that each relevant date shall be the date which numerically corresponds to the preceding such date in the calendar month which is the number of months specified in the relevant Final Terms as the Specified Period after the calendar month in which the preceding such date occurred *provided*, *however, that*:

  - (B) if any such date would otherwise fall on a day which is not a Business Day, then such date will be the first following day which is a Business Day unless that day falls in the next calendar month, in which case it will be the first preceding day which is a Business Day; and
  - (C) if the preceding such date occurred on the last day in a calendar month which was a Business Day, then all subsequent such dates will be the last day which is a Business Day in the calendar month which is the specified number of months after the calendar month in which the preceding such date occurred; and
- (v) "**No Adjustment**" means that the relevant date shall not be adjusted in accordance with any Business Day Convention;

"**Calculation Agent**" means the Fiscal Agent or such other Person specified in the relevant Final Terms as the party responsible for calculating the Rate(s) of Interest and Interest Amount(s) and/or such other amount(s) as may be specified in the relevant Final Terms;

"Coupon" means an interest coupon pertaining to a Bearer Note;

"Couponholder" means the holder of a Coupon;

"Coupon Sheet" means, in respect of a Bearer Note, a coupon sheet relating to such Note;

"**Day Count Fraction**" means (subject as provided in Condition 7), in respect of the calculation of an amount for any period of time (the "**Calculation Period**"), such day count fraction as may be specified in these Conditions or the relevant Final Terms and:

- (i) if "Actual/Actual" is so specified, means the actual number of days in the Calculation Period divided by 365 (or, if any portion of the Calculation Period falls in a leap year, the sum of (A) the actual number of days in that portion of the Calculation Period falling in a leap year divided by 366 and (B) the actual number of days in that portion of the Calculation Period falling in a non-leap year divided by 365);
- (ii) if "Actual/365 (Fixed)" is so specified, means the actual number of days in the Calculation Period divided by 365;
- (iii) if "Actual/360" is so specified, means the actual number of days in the Calculation Period divided by 360;
- (iv) if "**30/360**" is so specified, means the number of days in the Calculation Period divided by 360 calculated on a formula basis as follows:

specified in the applicable Final Terms) or (ii) such number would be 31, in which case D2 will be 30,

*provided, however, that* in each such case, the number of days in the Calculation Period is calculated from and including the first day of the Calculation Period to but excluding the last day of the Calculation Period.

"Guarantee" means, in relation to any Indebtedness of any Person, any obligation of another Person to pay such Indebtedness including (without limitation) any indemnity in respect of such indebtedness.

"Holder" means a Registered Holder or, as the context requires, the holder of a Bearer Note;

"ICMA" means the International Capital Markets Association;

"**Indebtedness**" means any indebtedness of any Person for money borrowed or raised including (without limitation) any indebtedness for or in respect of:

- (i) amounts raised by acceptance under any acceptance credit facility;
- (ii) amounts raised under any note purchase facility; or
- (iii) the amount of any liability in respect of leases or hire purchase contracts which would, in accordance with applicable law and generally accepted accounting principles, be treated as finance or capital leases,

but excluding any such indebtedness owed by one company within the Issuer's group of companies (including the Issuer) to another such company.

"Interest Amount" means, in relation to a Note and an Interest Period, the amount of interest payable in respect of that Note for that Interest Period;

"Interest Commencement Date" means the Issue Date of the Notes or such other date as may be specified as the Interest Commencement Date in the relevant Final Terms;

"Interest Determination Date" has the meaning given in the relevant Final Terms;

"Interest Payment Date" means the date or dates specified as such in, or determined in accordance with the provisions of, the relevant Final Terms and, if a Business Day Convention is specified in the relevant Final Terms:

- (i) as the same may be adjusted in accordance with the relevant Business Day Convention; or
- (ii) if the Business Day Convention is the FRN Convention, Floating Rate Convention or Eurodollar Convention and an interval of a number of calendar months is specified in the relevant Final Terms as being the Specified Period, each of such dates as may occur in accordance with the FRN Convention, Floating Rate Convention or Eurodollar Convention at such Specified Period of calendar months following the Interest Commencement Date (in the case of the first Interest Payment Date) or the previous Interest Payment Date (in any other case);

"Interest Period" means each period beginning on (and including) the Interest Commencement Date or any Interest Payment Date and ending on (but excluding) the next Interest Payment Date;

"**ISDA Definitions**" means the 2006 ISDA Definitions (as amended and updated as at the date of issue of the first Tranche of the Notes of the relevant Series (as specified in the relevant Final Terms) as published by the International Swaps and Derivatives Association, Inc. (formerly the International Swap Dealers Association, Inc.));

"Issue Date" has the meaning given in the relevant Final Terms;

"Maximum Redemption Amount" has the meaning given in the relevant Final Terms;

"Margin" has the meaning given in the relevant Final Terms;

"Maturity Date" has the meaning given in the relevant Final Terms;

"Minimum Redemption Amount" has the meaning given in the relevant Final Terms;

"Note Certificate" means a certificate issued to each Registered Holder in respect of its registered holding;

"Noteholder" means a holder of a Bearer Note or, as the context requires, a Registered Holder;

"**Optional Redemption Amount (Call)**" means, in respect of any Note, its principal amount or such other amount as may be specified in, or determined in accordance with, the relevant Final Terms;

"Optional Redemption Amount (Put)" means, in respect of any Note, its principal amount or such other amount as may be specified in, or determined in accordance with, the relevant Final Terms;

"Optional Redemption Date (Call)" has the meaning given in the relevant Final Terms;

"Optional Redemption Date (Put)" has the meaning given in the relevant Final Terms;

"**Participating Member State**" means a Member State of the European Communities which adopts the euro as its lawful currency in accordance with the Treaty;

"Payment Business Day" means:

- (i) if the currency of payment is euro, any day which is:
  - (A) a day on which banks in the relevant place of presentation are open for presentation and payment of bearer debt securities and for dealings in foreign currencies; and
  - (B) in the case of payment by transfer to an account, a TARGET2 Settlement Day and a day on which dealings in foreign currencies may be carried on in each (if any) Additional Financial Centre; or
- (ii) if the currency of payment is not euro, any day which is:
  - (A) a day on which banks in the relevant place of presentation are open for presentation and payment of bearer debt securities and for dealings in foreign currencies; and
  - (B) in the case of payment by transfer to an account, a day on which dealings in foreign currencies may be carried on in the Principal Financial Centre of the currency of payment and in each (if any) Additional Financial Centre;

"**Person**" means any individual, company, corporation, firm, partnership, joint venture, association, organisation, state or agency of a state or other entity, whether or not having separate legal personality;

"**Principal Financial Centre**" means, in relation to any currency, the principal financial centre for that currency, *provided, however, that*:

- (i) in relation to euro, it means the principal financial centre of such Member State of the European Communities as is selected (in the case of a payment) by the payee or (in the case of a calculation) by the Calculation Agent; and
- (ii) in relation to Australian dollars, it means either Sydney or Melbourne and, in relation to New Zealand dollars, it means either Wellington or Auckland; in each case as is selected (in the case of a payment) by the payee or (in the case of a calculation) by the Calculation Agent;

"**Principal Subsidiary**" means at any relevant time a Subsidiary of the Issuer at least 70 per cent. of whose share capital and voting rights are owned, directly or indirectly, by the Issuer and whose total assets and operating income (or, where the Subsidiary in question prepares consolidated accounts, whose total consolidated assets and consolidated operating income, as the case may be) attributable to the Issuer represent no less than 10 per cent. of the total consolidated assets and the consolidated operating income of the Issuer, all as calculated by reference to the then latest audited accounts (or consolidated accounts, as the case may be) of such Subsidiary and the then latest audited consolidated accounts of the Issuer and its consolidated subsidiaries;

"Project Financing" means any financing of the acquisition, construction or development of any asset in connection with a particular project where, pursuant to the terms of the agreement or agreements under

which the financing is provided, the creditors involved agree to look to the asset financed or the revenues to be generated by the operation of, or loss or damage to, the financed asset as the principal source of repayment and, once the asset, the acquisition, construction or development of which is being financed has been acquired, built or developed and is in use or operation, as the primary source of repayment for the monies to be advanced on the security of such asset;

"**Rate of Interest**" means the rate or rates (expressed as a percentage per annum) of interest payable in respect of the Notes specified in relevant Final Terms or calculated or determined in accordance with the provisions of these Conditions and/or the relevant Final Terms;

"**Register**" means the register maintained by the Registrar in respect of Registered Notes in accordance with the Issue and Paying Agency Agreement;

"Registered Note" means a Note in registered form;

"**Relevant Date**" means, in relation to any payment, whichever is the later of (a) the date on which the payment in question first becomes due and (b) if the full amount payable has not been received in the Principal Financial Centre of the currency of payment by the Fiscal Agent on or prior to such due date, the date on which (the full amount having been so received) notice to that effect has been given to the Noteholders;

"Relevant Financial Centre" has the meaning given in the relevant Final Terms;

"**Relevant Indebtedness**" means any Indebtedness which is in the form of or represented by any bond, note or debenture (obligations) instrument which at the time of issue is, or is intended by the Issuer to be, or which at any time thereafter the Issuer shall authorise to be, listed, quoted or traded on any stock exchange or in any securities market (including, without limitation, any over-the-counter market);

"**Relevant Screen Page**" means the page, section or other part of a particular information service (including, without limitation, the Reuter Monitor Money Rates Service and the Dow Jones Telerate Service) specified as the Relevant Screen Page in the relevant Final Terms, or such other page, section or other part as may replace it on that information service or such other information service, in each case, as may be nominated by the Person providing or sponsoring the information appearing there for the purpose of displaying rates or prices comparable to the Reference Rate;

"Relevant Time" has the meaning given in the relevant Final Terms;

"**Reserved Matter**" means any proposal to change any date fixed for payment of principal or interest in respect of the Notes, to reduce the amount of principal or interest payable on any date in respect of the Notes, to alter the method of calculating the amount of any payment in respect of the Notes or the date for any such payment, to change the currency of any payment under the Notes or to change the quorum requirements relating to meetings or the majority required to pass an Extraordinary Resolution;

"Security Interest" means any mortgage, charge, pledge, lien or other security interest (*sûreté réelle*), including, without limitation, anything analogous to any of the foregoing under the laws of any jurisdiction;

"**Specified Currency**" has the meaning given in the relevant Final Terms;

"Specified Denomination(s)" has the meaning given in the relevant Final Terms;

"Specified Office" has the meaning given in the Agency Agreement;

"Specified Period" has the meaning given in the relevant Final Terms;

"**Subsidiary**" means, in relation to any person or entity at any time, any other person or entity (whether or not now existing) as defined in article L233-1 of the French Commercial Code (the "French Commercial Code") or any other person or entity controlling directly or indirectly such person or entity within the meaning of article L233-3 of the French Commercial Code;

"Talon" means a talon for further Coupons;

"**TARGET2 Settlement Day**" means any day on which the Trans-European Automated Real-Time Gross Settlement Express Transfer (TARGET2) System is open;

"**Treaty**" means the Treaty establishing the European Communities, as amended by the Treaty on European Union; and

"Zero Coupon Note" means a Note specified as such in the relevant Final Terms.

- (b) *Interpretation:* In these Conditions:
  - (i) if the Notes are Zero Coupon Notes, references to Coupons and Couponholders are not applicable;
  - (ii) if Talons are specified in the relevant Final Terms as being attached to the Notes at the time of issue, references to Coupons shall be deemed to include references to Talons;
  - (iii) if Talons are not specified in the relevant Final Terms as being attached to the Notes at the time of issue, references to Talons are not applicable;
  - (iv) any reference to principal shall be deemed to include the Redemption Amount, any additional amounts in respect of principal which may be payable under Condition 13 (*Taxation*), any premium payable in respect of a Note and any other amount in the nature of principal payable pursuant to these Conditions;
  - (v) any reference to interest shall be deemed to include any additional amounts in respect of interest which may be payable under Condition 13 (*Taxation*) and any other amount in the nature of interest payable pursuant to these Conditions;
  - (vi) references to Notes being "outstanding" shall be construed in accordance with the Agency Agreement; and
  - (vii) if an expression is stated in paragraph (a) above to have the meaning given in the relevant Final Terms, but the relevant Final Terms gives no such meaning or specifies that such expression is "not applicable" then such expression is not applicable to the Notes.

## **3.** Form, Denomination and Title

The Notes are Bearer Notes and/or Registered Notes, as specified in the relevant Final Terms. Bearer Notes may not be exchanged for Registered Notes and *vice versa*.

#### Notes in Bearer Form

Bearer Notes are issued in the Specified Denomination(s) with Coupons and, if specified in the relevant Final Terms, Talons attached at the time of issue. In the case of a Series of Bearer Notes with more than one Specified Denomination, Bearer Notes of one Specified Denomination will not be exchangeable for Bearer Notes of another Specified Denomination. Title to Bearer Notes and Coupons will pass by delivery. The holder of any Bearer Note or Coupon shall (except as otherwise required by law) be treated as its absolute owner for all purposes (whether or not it is overdue and regardless of any notice of ownership, trust or any other interest therein, any writing thereon or any notice of any previous loss or theft thereof) and no Person shall be liable for so treating such Holder.

#### Notes in Registered Form

Registered Notes are issued in the Specified Denominations and may be held in holdings equal to the Specified Minimum Amount (specified in the relevant Final Terms) and integral multiples equal to the Specified Increments (specified in the relevant Final Terms) in excess thereof (an "Authorised Holding"). The Holder of each Registered Note shall (except as otherwise required by law) be treated as its absolute owner for all purposes (whether or not it is overdue and regardless of any notice of ownership, trust or any other interest therein, any writing on the Note Certificate relating thereto (other than the endorsed form of transfer) or any previous loss or theft of such Note Certificate) and no person shall be liable for so treating such Holder.

For the avoidance of doubt, the Specified Denomination of Notes admitted to trading on a Regulated Market within the European Economic Area or offered to the public in a Member State of the European Economic Area in circumstances which require the publication of a prospectus under the Prospectus Directive will be  $\leq 100,000$  (or, if the Notes are denominated in a currency other than euro, the equivalent amount in such currency).

#### 4. Register and Transfers of Registered Notes

- (a) *Register:* The Registrar will maintain the Register in accordance with the provisions of the Agency Agreement. A Note Certificate will be issued to each Registered Holder in respect of its holding. Each Note Certificate will be numbered serially with an identifying number which will be recorded in the Register.
- (b) Transfers: Subject to paragraphs (e) and (f) below, a Registered Note may be transferred upon surrender of the relevant Note Certificate, with the endorsed form of transfer duly completed, at the Specified Office of the Registrar or any Transfer Agent, together with such evidence as the Registrar or (as the case may be) such Transfer Agent may reasonably require to prove the title of the transferor and the authority of the individuals who have executed the form of transfer; *provided, however, that* a Registered Note may not be transferred unless the principal amount of Registered Notes transferred and (where not all of the Registered Notes held by a Holder are being transferred) the principal amount of the balance of Notes not transferred are Authorised Holdings. Where not all the Registered Notes represented by the surrendered Note Certificate are the subject of the transfer, a new Note Certificate in respect of the balance of the Registered Notes will be issued to the transferor.
- (c) Registration and delivery of Note Certificates: Within five business days of the surrender of a Note Certificate in accordance with paragraph (a) above, the Registrar will register the transfer in question and deliver a new Note Certificate of a like principal amount to the Registered Notes transferred to each Registered Holder at its Specified Office or (as the case may be) the Specified Office of any Transfer Agent or (at the request and risk of any such relevant Registered Holder) by uninsured first class mail (airmail if overseas) to the address specified for the purpose by such Registered Holder. In this paragraph, "business day" means a day on which commercial banks are open for business (including dealings in foreign currencies) in the city where the Registrar or (as the case may be) the relevant Transfer Agent has its Specified Office.
- (d) No charge: The transfer of a Registered Note will be effected without charge by or on behalf of the Issuer, the Registrar or any Transfer Agent but against such indemnity as the Registrar or (as the case may be) such Transfer Agent may require in respect of any tax or other duty of whatsoever nature which may be levied or imposed in connection with such transfer.
- (e) *Closed periods:* Registered Holders may not require transfers to be registered during the period of 15 calendar days ending on the due date for any payment of principal or interest in respect of the Registered Notes.
- (f) *Regulations concerning transfers and registration:* All transfers of Registered Notes and entries on the Register are subject to the detailed regulations concerning the transfer of Registered Notes scheduled to the Agency Agreement. The regulations may be changed by the Issuer with the prior written approval of the Registrar. A copy of the current regulations will be mailed (free of charge) by the Registrar to any Registered Holder who requests in writing a copy of such regulations.

## 5. Status

The Notes constitute direct, general and unconditional obligations of the Issuer which will at all times rank *pari passu* among themselves and at least *pari passu* with all other present and future unsecured

obligations of the Issuer, save for such obligations as may be preferred by provisions of law that are both mandatory and of general application.

#### 6. Negative Pledge

So long as any Note remains outstanding, the Issuer shall not, and the Issuer shall procure that its Principal Subsidiaries will not, create or permit to subsist any Security Interest upon the whole or any part of its present or future undertaking, assets or revenues (including uncalled capital) to secure any Relevant Indebtedness or Guarantee of Relevant Indebtedness without (a) at the same time or prior thereto securing the Notes equally and rateably therewith or (b) providing such other security for the Notes as may be approved by an Extraordinary Resolution of Noteholders.

The above provision shall not apply to the following:

- (a) any Security Interest existing at the time of acquisition of any asset acquired by it after the Issue Date and not created in contemplation of that acquisition;
- (b) any Security Interest to secure Indebtedness incurred in connection with any Project Financing; or
- (c) any Security Interest upon any of its present or future assets or revenues which is created pursuant to any securitisation arrangement whereby the Relevant Indebtedness secured by such Security Interest is limited to the value of such assets or revenues.

# 7. Fixed Rate Note Provisions

- (a) *Application:* This Condition 7 (*Fixed Rate Note Provisions*) is applicable to the Notes only if the Fixed Rate Note Provisions are specified in the relevant Final Terms as being applicable.
- (b) Accrual of interest: The Notes bear interest from the Interest Commencement Date at the Rate of Interest payable in arrear on each Interest Payment Date, subject as provided in Condition 12 (*Payments*). Each Note will cease to bear interest from the due date for redemption unless, upon due presentation, payment of the Redemption Amount is improperly withheld or refused, in which case it will continue to bear interest in accordance with this Condition 7 (as well after as before judgment) until whichever is the earlier of (i) the day on which all sums due in respect of such Note up to that day are received by or on behalf of the relevant Noteholder and (ii) the day which is five days after date upon which the Fiscal Agent has received the full amount of the moneys payable and has notified the Noteholders to such effect.
- (c) *Fixed Coupon Amount:* The amount of interest payable in respect of each Note for any Interest Period shall be the relevant Fixed Coupon Amount and, if the Notes are in more than one Specified Denomination, shall be the relevant Fixed Coupon Amount in respect of the relevant Specified Denomination.
- (d) *Regular Interest Periods:* If all of the Interest Payment Dates fall at regular intervals between the Issue Date and the Maturity Date, then:
  - (i) the Notes shall for the purposes of this Condition 7 be "Regular Interest Period Notes";
  - (ii) the day and month (but not the year) on which any Interest Payment Date falls shall for the purposes of this Condition 7 be a "Regular Date"; and
  - (iii) each period from and including a Regular Date falling in any year to, but excluding the next succeeding Regular Date shall for the purposes of this Condition 7 be a "Regular Period".
- (e) *Irregular first or last Interest Periods:* If the Notes would be Regular Interest Period Notes but for the fact that either or both of:
  - (i) the interval between the Issue Date and the first Interest Payment Date; and
  - (ii) the interval between the Maturity Date and the immediately preceding Interest Payment Date,

is longer or shorter than a Regular Period, then the Notes shall nevertheless be deemed to be Regular Interest Period Notes, *provided, however, that* if the interval between the Maturity Date and the immediately preceding Interest Payment Date is longer or shorter than a Regular Period, the day and month on which the Maturity Date falls shall not be a "Regular Date".

(f) *Irregular interest amount:* If the Notes are Regular Interest Period Notes, the amount of interest payable in respect of each Note for any period which is not a Regular Period shall be calculated by applying the Rate of Interest to the principal amount of such Note, multiplying the product by the relevant Day Count

Fraction and rounding the resulting figure to the nearest sub-unit of the Specified Currency (half a subunit being rounded upwards). For this purpose a "sub-unit" means, in the case of any currency other than euro, the lowest amount of such currency that is available as legal tender in the country of such currency and, in the case of euro, means one cent.

- (g) *Day Count Fraction:* In respect of any period which is not a Regular Period the relevant day count fraction (the "Day Count Fraction") shall be determined in accordance with the following provisions:
  - (i) if the Day Count Fraction is specified in the relevant Final Terms as being 30/360, the relevant Day Count Fraction will be the number of days in the relevant period (calculated on the basis of a year of 360 days consisting of 12 months of 30 days each and, in the case of an incomplete month, the actual number of days elapsed) divided by 360;
  - (ii) if the Day Count Fraction is specified in the relevant Final Terms as being Actual/Actual (ICMA) and the relevant period falls during a Regular Period, the relevant Day Count Fraction will be the number of days in the relevant period divided by the product of (A) the number of days in the Regular Period in which the relevant period falls and (B) the number of Regular Periods in any period of one year; and
  - (iii) if the Day Count Fraction is specified in the relevant Final Terms as being Actual/Actual (ICMA) and the relevant period begins in one Regular Period and ends in the next succeeding Regular Period, interest will be calculated on the basis of the sum of:
    - (A) the number of days in the relevant period falling within the first such Regular Period divided by the product of (1) the number of days in the first such Regular Period and (2) the number of Regular Periods in any period of one year; and
    - (B) the number of days in the relevant period falling within the second such Regular Period divided by the product of (1) the number of days in the second such Regular Period and (2) the number of Regular Periods in any period of one year.
- (h) *Number of days:* For the purposes of this Condition 7, unless the Day Count Fraction is specified in the relevant Final Terms as being 30/360 (in which case the provisions of paragraph (g)(i) above shall apply), the number of days in any period shall be calculated on the basis of actual calendar days from and including the first day of the relevant period to but excluding the last day of the relevant period.
- (i) *Irregular Interest Periods:* If the Notes are not Regular Interest Period Notes and interest is required to be calculated for any period other than an Interest Period, interest shall be calculated on such basis as is described in the relevant Final Terms.

## 8. Floating Rate Note Provisions

- (a) *Application:* This Condition 8 (*Floating Rate Note Provisions*) is applicable to the Notes only if the Floating Rate Note Provisions are specified in the relevant Final Terms as being applicable.
- (b) *Accrual of interest:* The Notes bear interest from, and including, the Interest Commencement Date at the Rate of Interest payable in arrear on each Interest Payment Date, subject as provided in Condition 12 (*Payments*). Each Note will cease to bear interest from the due date for redemption unless, upon due presentation, payment of the Redemption Amount is improperly withheld or refused, in which case it will continue to bear interest in accordance with this Condition (as well after as before judgment) until whichever is the earlier of (i) the day on which all sums due in respect of such Note up to that day are received by or on behalf of the relevant Noteholder and (ii) the day which is five days after the date upon which the Fiscal Agent has received the full amount of the moneys payable and has notified the Noteholders to such effect.
- (c) *Screen Rate Determination:* If Screen Rate Determination is specified in the relevant Final Terms as the manner in which the Rate(s) of Interest is/are to be determined, the Rate of Interest applicable to the Notes for each Interest Period will be determined by the Calculation Agent on the following basis:
  - (i) if the Reference Rate is a composite quotation or customarily supplied by one entity, the Calculation Agent will determine the Reference Rate which appears on the Relevant Screen Page as of the Relevant Time on the relevant Interest Determination Date;
  - (ii) in any other case, the Calculation Agent will determine the arithmetic mean of the Reference Rates which appear on the Relevant Screen Page as of the Relevant Time on the relevant Interest Determination Date;

- (iii) if, in the case of (i) above, such rate does not appear on that page or, in the case of (ii) above, fewer than two such rates appear on that page or if, in either case, the Relevant Screen Page is unavailable, the Calculation Agent will:
  - (A) request the principal Relevant Financial Centre office of each of the Reference Banks to provide a quotation of the Reference Rate at approximately the Relevant Time on the Interest Determination Date to prime banks in the Relevant Financial Centre interbank market in an amount that is representative for a single transaction in that market at that time; and
  - (B) determine the arithmetic mean of such quotations; and
- (iv) if fewer than two such quotations are provided as requested, the Calculation Agent will determine the arithmetic mean of the rates (being the nearest to the Reference Rate, as determined by the Calculation Agent) quoted by major banks in the Principal Financial Centre of the Specified Currency, selected by the Calculation Agent, at approximately 11.00 a.m. (local time in the Principal Financial Centre of the Specified Currency) on the first day of the relevant Interest Period for loans in the Specified Currency to leading European banks for a period equal to the relevant Interest Period and in an amount that is representative for a single transaction in that market at that time,

and the Rate of Interest for such Interest Period shall be the sum of the Margin and the rate or (as the case may be) the arithmetic mean so determined; *provided*, *however*, *that* if the Calculation Agent is unable to determine a rate or (as the case may be) an arithmetic mean in accordance with the above provisions in relation to any Interest Period, the Rate of Interest applicable to the Notes during such Interest Period will be the sum of the Margin and the rate (or as the case may be) the arithmetic mean last determined in relation to the Notes in respect of a preceding Interest Period.

- (d) ISDA Determination: If ISDA Determination is specified in the relevant Final Terms as the manner in which the Rate(s) of Interest is/are to be determined, the Rate of Interest applicable to the Notes for each Interest Period will be the sum of the Margin and the relevant ISDA Rate where "ISDA Rate" in relation to any Interest Period means a rate equal to the Floating Rate (as defined in the ISDA Definitions) that would be determined by the Calculation Agent under an interest rate swap transaction if the Calculation Agent were acting as Calculation Agent for that interest rate swap transaction under the terms of an agreement incorporating the ISDA Definitions and under which:
  - (i) the Floating Rate Option (as defined in the ISDA Definitions) is as specified in the relevant Final Terms;
  - (ii) the Designated Maturity (as defined in the ISDA Definitions) is a period specified in the relevant Final Terms; and
  - (iii) the relevant Reset Date (as defined in the ISDA Definitions) is either (A) if the relevant Floating Rate Option is based on the London inter-bank offered rate (LIBOR) for a currency, the first day of that Interest Period or (B) in any other case, as specified in the relevant Final Terms.
- (e) *Maximum or Minimum Rate of Interest:* If any Maximum Rate of Interest or Minimum Rate of Interest is specified in the relevant Final Terms, then the Rate of Interest shall in no event be greater than the maximum or be less than the minimum so specified.
- (f) Calculation of Interest Amount: The Calculation Agent will, as soon as practicable after the time at which the Rate of Interest is to be determined in relation to each Interest Period, calculate the Interest Amount payable in respect of each Note for such Interest Period. The Interest Amount will be calculated by applying the Rate of Interest for such Interest Period to the principal amount of such Note during such Interest Period and multiplying the product by the relevant Day Count Fraction.
- (g) *Giving of Notices:* The Calculation Agent will cause each Rate of Interest and Interest Amount determined by it, together with the relevant Interest Payment Date, and any other amount(s) required to be determined by it together with any relevant payment date(s) to be notified to the Issuer, the Paying Agents and each stock exchange (if any) on which the Notes are then listed as soon as practicable after such determination but (in the case of each Rate of Interest, Interest Amount and Interest Payment Date) in any event not later than the first day of the relevant Interest Period. Notice thereof shall also promptly be given to the Noteholders. The Calculation Agent will be entitled to recalculate any Interest Amount (on the basis of the foregoing provisions) without notice in the event of an extension or shortening of the relevant Interest Period.

(h) Notifications etc: All notifications, opinions, determinations, certificates, calculations, quotations and decisions given, expressed, made or obtained for the purposes of this Condition by the Calculation Agent will (in the absence of manifest error) be binding on the Issuer, the Paying Agents, the Noteholders and the Couponholders and (subject as aforesaid) no liability to any such Person will attach to the Calculation Agent in connection with the exercise or non-exercise by it of its powers, duties and discretions for such purposes.

## 9. Zero Coupon Note Provisions

- (a) *Application:* Unless otherwise specified in the applicable Final Terms, this Condition 9 (*Zero Coupon Note Provisions*) is applicable to the Notes only if the Zero Coupon Note Provisions are specified in the relevant Final Terms as being applicable.
- (b) *Late payment on Zero Coupon Notes:* If the Redemption Amount payable in respect of any Zero Coupon Note is improperly withheld or refused, the Redemption Amount shall thereafter be an amount equal to the sum of:
  - (i) the Reference Price; and
  - (ii) the product of the Accrual Yield (compounded annually) being applied to the Reference Price from (and including) the Issue Date to (but excluding) whichever is the earlier of (i) the day on which all sums due in respect of such Note up to that day are received by or on behalf of the relevant Noteholder and (ii) the day which is seven days after the Fiscal Agent has notified the Noteholders that it has received all sums due in respect of the Notes up to such seventh day (except to the extent that there is any subsequent default in payment).

## 11. Redemption and Purchase

- (a) *Scheduled redemption:* Unless previously redeemed, or purchased and cancelled, the Notes will be redeemed at their Final Redemption Amount, which shall be the principal amount of such Note unless another amount is specified in the applicable Final Terms, on the Maturity Date, subject as provided in Condition 12 (Payments).
- (b) *Redemption for tax reasons:* The Notes may be redeemed at the option of the Issuer in whole, but not in part:
  - (i) at any time (if neither the Floating Rate Note Provisions are specified in the relevant Final Terms as being applicable); or
  - (ii) on any Interest Payment Date (if the Floating Rate Note Provisions are specified in the relevant Final Terms as being applicable),

on giving not less than 30 nor more than 60 calendar days' notice to the Noteholders (which notice shall be irrevocable), at their Early Redemption Amount (Tax), together with interest accrued (if any) to the date fixed for redemption, if:

- (A) the Issuer has or will become obliged to pay additional amounts as provided or referred to in Condition 13 (Taxation) as a result of any change in, or amendment to, the laws or regulations of France or any political subdivision or any authority thereof or therein having power to tax, or any change in the application or official interpretation of such laws or regulations (including a holding by a court of competent jurisdiction), which change or amendment becomes effective on or after the date of issue of the first Tranche of the Notes; and
- (B) such obligation cannot be avoided by the Issuer taking reasonable measures available to it, *provided, however, that* no such notice of redemption shall be given earlier than:
  - (1) where the Notes may be redeemed at any time, 90 calendar days prior to the earliest date on which the Issuer would be obliged to pay such additional amounts if a payment in respect of the Notes were then due; or
  - (2) where the Notes may be redeemed only on an Interest Payment Date, 60 calendar days prior to the Interest Payment Date occurring immediately before the earliest date on which the Issuer would be obliged to pay such additional amounts if a payment in respect of the Notes were then due.

In addition, if the Issuer would on the occasion of the next payment due under the Notes, and in the reasonable opinion of a duly authorised offer of the Issuer having knowledge of such matters, be

prevented by French law from making payment to the Noteholders of the full amount then due and payable, notwithstanding the undertaking to pay additional amounts contained above, then the Issuer shall forthwith give notice of such fact to the Fiscal Agent and the Issuer shall forthwith redeem all, but not some only, of the Notes then outstanding, upon giving not less than 30 nor more than 60 calendar days' irrevocable notice to the Noteholders, provided that the due date for redemption of which notice hereunder shall be given, shall be the latest practicable date on which the Issuer could make payment without withholding for French taxes, or if such date is past, as soon as practicable thereafter.

Notes redeemed pursuant to this Condition 11(b) will be redeemed at their Early Redemption Amount (Tax), together (if appropriate) with interest accrued to (but excluding) the date of redemption.

- (c) Redemption at the option of the Issuer: If the Call Option is specified in the relevant Final Terms as being applicable, the Notes may be redeemed at the option of the Issuer in whole or, if so specified in the relevant Final Terms, in part on any Optional Redemption Date (Call) at the relevant Optional Redemption Amount (Call) on the Issuer's giving not less than 30 nor more than 60 calendar days' notice to the Noteholders (which notice shall be irrevocable and shall oblige the Issuer to redeem the Notes or, as the case may be, the Notes specified in such notice on the relevant Optional Redemption Date (Call) at the Optional Redemption Amount (Call) plus accrued interest (if any) to such date).
- (d) *Partial redemption:* 
  - (i) *Partial redemption of Bearer Notes:*

If Bearer Notes are to be redeemed in part only on any date in accordance with Condition 11(c) (*Redemption at the option of the Issuer*), the Notes to be redeemed shall be selected by the drawing of lots in such place as the Fiscal Agent approves and in such manner as the Fiscal Agent considers appropriate, subject to compliance with applicable law and the rules of each stock exchange on which the Notes are then listed, and the notice to Noteholders referred to in Condition 11(c) (*Redemption at the option of the Issuer*) shall specify the serial numbers of the Notes so to be redeemed. If any Maximum Redemption Amount or Minimum Redemption Amount is specified in the relevant Final Terms, then the Optional Redemption Amount (Call) shall in no event be greater than the maximum or be less than the minimum so specified;

(ii) *Partial Redemption of Registered Notes:* 

If Registered Notes are to be redeemed in part only on any date in accordance with Condition 11(c) (Redemption at the option of the Issuer), each Registered Note shall be redeemed in part in the proportion which the aggregate principal amount of the outstanding Registered Notes to be redeemed on the relevant Option Redemption Date (Call) bears to the aggregate principal amount of outstanding Registered Notes on such date.

(e) Redemption at the option of Noteholders: If the Put Option is specified in the relevant Final Terms as being applicable, the Issuer shall, at the option of the Holder of any Note redeem such Note on the Optional Redemption Date (Put) specified in the relevant Redemption Notice at the relevant Optional Redemption Amount (Put) together with interest (if any) accrued to such date. In order to exercise the option contained in this Condition 11(e), the Holder of a Note must, not less than 30 nor more than 60 calendar days before the relevant Optional Redemption Date (Put), deposit with any Agent such Note together, in the case of Bearer Notes, with all unmatured Coupons relating thereto and a duly completed Redemption Notice in the form obtainable from any Agent. The Agent with which a Note is so deposited shall deliver a duly completed Redemption Notice Receipt to the depositing Holder. No Note, once deposited with a duly completed Redemption Notice in accordance with this Condition 11(e), may be withdrawn; provided, however, that if, prior to the relevant Optional Redemption Date (Put). any such Note becomes immediately due and payable or, upon due presentation of any such Note on the relevant Optional Redemption Date (Put), payment of the redemption moneys is improperly withheld or refused, the relevant Agent shall mail notification thereof to the depositing Noteholder at such address as may have been given by such Noteholder in the relevant Redemption Notice and shall hold such Note at its Specified Office for collection by the depositing Noteholder against surrender of the relevant Redemption Notice Receipt. For so long as any outstanding Note is held by an Agent in accordance with this Condition 11(e), the depositor of such Note and not such Agent shall be deemed to be the holder of Note for all purposes.

(f) Make-whole Redemption by the Issuer:

Unless specified as not being applicable in the relevant Final Terms, the Issuer may, having given:

- (a) not less than 15 nor more than 30 calendar days' notice to the Noteholders in accordance with Condition 20 (*Notices*); and
- (b) not less than 15 days before the giving of notice referred to in (i) above, notice to the Fiscal Agent, the Quotation Agent and such other parties as may be specified in the Final Terms,

(which notices shall be irrevocable and shall specify the date fixed for redemption (each such date, a "**Make-whole Redemption Date**") redeem, in whole or in part, the Notes then outstanding at any time prior to their Maturity Date at their relevant Make-whole Redemption Amount.

"Calculation Date" means the third Business Day (as defined above) prior to the Make-whole Redemption Date.

"Make-whole Redemption Amount" means the sum of:

- (i) the greater of (x) the Final Redemption Amount of the Notes so redeemed and (y) the sum of the then present values of the remaining scheduled payments of principal and interest on such Notes (excluding any interest accruing on the Notes to, but excluding, the relevant Make-whole Redemption Date) discounted to the relevant Make-whole Redemption Date on either an annual or a semi-annual basis (as specified in the relevant Final Terms) at the Make-whole Redemption Rate plus a Make-whole Redemption Margin; and
- (ii) any interest accrued but not paid on the Notes to, but excluding, the Make-whole Redemption Date,

as determined by the Quotation Agent and as notified on the Calculation Date by the Quotation Agent to the Issuer, the Fiscal Agent and such other parties as may be specified in the Final Terms.

"Make-whole Redemption Margin" means the margin specified as such in the relevant Final Terms.

"**Make-whole Redemption Rate**" means the average of the four quotations given by the Reference Dealers of the mid-market yield to maturity of the Reference Security on the third Business Day preceding the Make-whole Redemption Date at 11:00 a.m. (Central European Time ("**CET**")).

"Quotation Agent" means any Dealer or any other international credit institution or financial services institution appointed by the Issuer for the purpose of determining the Make-whole Redemption Amount, in each case as such Quotation Agent is identified in the relevant Final Terms.

"**Reference Dealers**" means each of the four banks, as specified in the relevant Final Terms, selected by the Quotation Agent, which are primary European government security dealers, and their respective successors, or market makers in pricing corporate bond issues.

"**Reference Security**" means the security specified as such in the relevant Final Terms. If a Reference Security is no longer outstanding, a Similar Security will be chosen by the Quotation Agent at 11:00 a.m. (CET) on the third Business Day preceding the Make-whole Redemption Date, quoted in writing by the Quotation Agent to the Issuer and published in accordance with Condition 20 (*Notices*).

"**Similar Security**" means a reference bond or reference bonds issued by the same issuer as the Reference Security having actual or interpolated maturity comparable with the remaining term of the Notes that would be utilised, at the time of selection and in accordance with customary financial practice, in pricing new issues of corporate debt securities of comparable maturity to the remaining term of the Notes.

The determination of any rate or amount, the obtaining of each quotation and the making of each determination or calculation by the Quotation Agent shall (in the absence of manifest error) be final and binding upon all parties.

In the case of a partial redemption of Notes, the relevant provisions of Condition 11(d) (*Partial Redemption*) shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to this Condition 11(f).

(g) *No other redemption:* The Issuer shall not be entitled to redeem the Notes otherwise than as provided in paragraphs (a) to (f) above.

- (h) *Early redemption of Zero Coupon Notes:* Unless otherwise specified in the relevant Final Terms, the Redemption Amount payable on redemption of a Zero Coupon Note at any time before the Maturity Date shall be an amount equal to the sum of:
  - (i) the Reference Price; and
  - (ii) the product of the Accrual Yield (compounded annually) being applied to the Reference Price from (and including) the Issue Date to (but excluding) the date fixed for redemption or (as the case may be) the date upon which the Note becomes due and payable.

Where such calculation is to be made for a period which is not a whole number of years, the calculation in respect of the period of less than a full year shall be made on the basis of such Day Count Fraction as may be specified in the Final Terms for the purposes of this Condition 11(h) or, if none is so specified, a Day Count Fraction of 30E/360.

- (i) *Purchase:* The Issuer or any of its Subsidiaries may at any time purchase Notes in the open market or otherwise and at any price subject to applicable laws and regulations.
- (j) Cancellation: All Notes so redeemed by the Issuer and any unmatured Coupons attached to or surrendered with them shall be cancelled and may not be reissued or resold and all Notes purchased by the Issuer or any Subsidiaries shall be cancelled provided all unmatured Coupons are attached thereto save that Notes purchased in accordance with Condition 11(i) above (*Purchase*) by the Issuer or any Subsidiaries may be held and resold in accordance with applicable laws and regulations for the purpose of enhancing the liquidity of the Notes.

# 12. Payments

## Payments under Bearer Notes

- (a) Principal: Payments of principal shall be made only against presentation and (provided that payment is made in full) surrender of Bearer Notes at the Specified Office of any Paying Agent outside the United States by transfer to an account denominated in that currency (or, if that currency is euro, any other account to which euro may be credited or transferred) and maintained by the payee with, a bank in the Principal Financial Centre of that currency.
- (b) *Interest:* Payments of interest shall, subject to paragraph (h) below, be made only against presentation and (provided that payment is made in full) surrender of the appropriate Coupons at the Specified Office of any Paying Agent outside the United States in the manner described in paragraph (a) above.
- (c) Payments in New York City: Payments of principal or interest may be made at the Specified Office of an Agent in New York City if (i) the Issuer has appointed Agents outside the United States with the reasonable expectation that such Agents will be able to make payment of the full amount of the interest on the Bearer Notes in the currency in which the payment is due when due, (ii) payment of the full amount of such interest at the offices of all such Agents is illegal or effectively precluded by exchange controls or other similar restrictions and (iii) payment is permitted by applicable United States law.
- (d) Payments subject to fiscal laws: All payments in respect of the Bearer Notes are subject in all cases to any applicable fiscal or other laws and regulations in the place of payment, but without prejudice to the provisions of Condition 13 (*Taxation*). No commissions or expenses shall be charged to the Noteholders or Couponholders in respect of such payments.
- (e) *Deductions for unmatured Coupons:* If the relevant Final Terms specify that the Fixed Rate Note Provisions are applicable and a Bearer Note is presented without all unmatured Coupons relating thereto:
  - (i) if the aggregate amount of the missing Coupons is less than or equal to the amount of principal due for payment, a sum equal to the aggregate amount of the missing Coupons will be deducted from the amount of principal due for payment; *provided, however, that* if the gross amount available for payment is less than the amount of principal due for payment, the sum deducted will be that proportion of the aggregate amount of such missing Coupons which the gross amount actually available for payment bears to the amount of principal due for payment;
  - (ii) if the aggregate amount of the missing Coupons is greater than the amount of principal due for payment:
    - (A) so many of such missing Coupons shall become void (in inverse order of maturity) as will result in the aggregate amount of the remainder of such missing Coupons (the "Relevant Coupons") being equal to the amount of principal due for payment; *provided, however,*

*that* where this sub-paragraph would otherwise require a fraction of a missing Coupon to become void, such missing Coupon shall become void in its entirety; and

(B) a sum equal to the aggregate amount of the Relevant Coupons (or, if less, the amount of principal due for payment) will be deducted from the amount of principal due for payment; *provided, however, that,* if the gross amount available for payment is less than the amount of principal due for payment, the sum deducted will be that proportion of the aggregate amount of the Relevant Coupons (or, as the case may be, the amount of principal due for payment) which the gross amount actually available for payment bears to the amount of principal due for payment.

Each sum of principal so deducted shall be paid in the manner provided in paragraph (a) above against presentation and (provided that payment is made in full) surrender of the relevant missing Coupons.

- (f) Unmatured Coupons void: If the relevant Final Terms specify that this Condition 12(f) is applicable or that the Floating Rate Note Provisions are applicable, on the due date for final redemption of any Note or early redemption of such Note pursuant to Condition 11(b) (*Redemption for tax reasons*), Condition 11(e) (*Redemption at the option of Noteholders*), Condition 11(c) (*Redemption at the option of Noteholders*), Condition 11(c) (*Redemption at the option of the Issuer*), or Condition 14 (*Events of Default*), all unmatured Coupons relating thereto (whether or not still attached) shall become void and no payment will be made in respect thereof.
- (g) *Payments on business days:* If the due date for payment of any amount in respect of any Note or Coupon is not a Payment Business Day in the place of presentation, the holder shall not be entitled to payment in such place of the amount due until the next succeeding Payment Business Day in such place and shall not be entitled to any further interest or other payment in respect of any such delay.
- (h) *Payments other than in respect of matured Coupons:* Payments of interest other than in respect of matured Coupons shall be made only against presentation of the relevant Notes at the Specified Office of any Agent outside the United States (or in New York City if permitted by paragraph (c) above).
- (i) *Partial payments:* If a Paying Agent makes a partial payment in respect of any Note or Coupon presented to it for payment, such Paying Agent will endorse thereon a statement indicating the amount and date of such payment.
- (j) Exchange of Talons: On or after the maturity date of the final Coupon which is (or was at the time of issue) part of a Coupon Sheet relating to the Notes, the Talon forming part of such Coupon Sheet may be exchanged at the Specified Office of the Fiscal Agent for a further Coupon Sheet (including, if appropriate, a further Talon but excluding any Coupons in respect of which claims have already become void pursuant to Condition 15 (*Prescription*)). Upon the due date for redemption of any Note, any unexchanged Talon relating to such Note shall become void and no Coupon will be delivered in respect of such Talon.

## Payments under Registered Notes

- (a) Principal: Payments of principal shall be made upon application by a Registered Holder to the specified office of the Fiscal Agent not later than the fifteenth day before the due date for any such payment (the "Record Date"), by transfer to an account denominated in such currency (or, if that currency is euro, any other account to which euro may be credited or transferred) maintained by the payee with a bank in the Principal Financial Centre of such currency.
- (b) Interest: Payments of interest shall be made upon application by a Registered Holder to the specified office of the Fiscal Agent not later than the Record Date, by transfer to an account denominated in such currency (or, if that currency is euro, any other account to which euro may be credited or transferred) maintained by the payee with a bank in the Principal Financial Centre of such currency and, in the case of interest payable on redemption) upon surrender (or, in the case of part payment only, endorsement) of the relevant Note Certificate at the specified office of any Agent.
- (c) *Payments subject to fiscal laws:* All payments in respect of the Registered Notes are subject in all cases to any applicable fiscal or other laws and regulations in the place of payment, but without prejudice to the provisions of Condition 13 (*Taxation*). No commissions or expenses shall be charged to the Registered Holders in respect of such payments.
- (d) *Payments on business days:* Where payment is to be made by transfer to an account, payment instructions (for value the due date, or, if the due date is not a business day, for value the next succeeding business day) will be initiated. A Registered Holder shall not be entitled to any interest or other payment

in respect of any delay in payment resulting from the due date for a payment not being a business day. In this paragraph, "**business day**" means:

- (i) if the currency of payment is euro, any day which is in the case of payment by transfer to an account, a TARGET2 Settlement Day and a day on which dealings in foreign currencies may be carried on in each (if any) Additional Financial Centre; or
- (ii) if the currency of payment is not euro, any day which is in the case of payment by transfer to an account, a day on which dealings in foreign currencies may be carried on in the Principal Financial Centre of the currency of payment and in each (if any) Additional Financial Centre;

and, in the case of surrender (or, in the case of part payment only, endorsement) of a Note Certificate, in the place in which the Note Certificate is surrender (or, as the case may be, endorsed).

## 13. Taxation

*Tax Exemption:* All payments of principal and interest (if any) by the Issuer will be made without withholding or deduction for, or on account of, any present or future taxes, duties, assessments or other governmental charges whatsoever imposed or levied by or on behalf of France or any political subdivision thereof or any authority therein or thereof having power to tax, unless the withholding or deduction of such taxes, duties, assessments or governmental charges is required by law.

In the event that French law should require that any payments in respect of the Notes or the Coupons (if relevant) be subject to deduction or withholding with respect to any present or future taxes, duties, assessments or other governmental charges whatsoever imposed or levied by or on behalf of the Republic of France, the Issuer shall, to the fullest extent then permitted by law, pay such additional amounts as will result in the receipt by the Noteholders and the Couponholders (if relevant) of such amounts as would have been received by them if no such withholding or deduction had been required, except that no such additional amounts shall be payable in respect of any Note or Coupon presented for payment:

- by or on behalf of a holder (including a beneficial owner (*ayant droit*)) which is liable to such taxes, duties, assessments or governmental charges in respect of such Note or Coupon by reason of its having some connection with France other than the mere holding (or beneficial ownership) of such Note or Coupon;
- (ii) by or on behalf of a holder who could avoid such withholding or deduction by making a declaration of non-residence or similar claim for exemption but fails to do so; or
- (iii) more than 30 calendar days after the Relevant Date except to the extent that the relevant holder would have been entitled to such additional amounts if it had presented such Note or Coupon on the last day of such period of 30 calendar days;
- (iv) where such withholding or deduction is imposed on a payment to an individual and is required to be made pursuant to European Council Directive 2003/48/EC or any other Directive implementing the conclusions of the ECOFIN Council meeting of 26-27 November, 2000 on the taxation of savings income or any law implementing or complying with, or introduced in order to conform to, such Directive; or
- (v) by or on behalf of a holder who would have been able to avoid such withholding or deduction by presenting the relevant Note, Receipt or Coupon to another Paying Agent in a Member State of the European Union.

## 14. Events of Default

If any of the following events occurs and is continuing:

- (a) *Non-payment:* the Issuer fails to pay any amount of principal or interest in respect of the Notes and such default is not remedied within a period of 15 calendar days from such date; or
- (b) *Breach of other obligations:* the Issuer defaults in the performance or observance of any of its other obligations under or in respect of the Notes and such default remains unremedied for 30 calendar days after written notice thereof, addressed to the Issuer by any Noteholder, has been delivered to the Issuer or to the Specified Office of the Fiscal Agent requiring such default to be remedied; or

- (c) *Cross-default:* 
  - (i) any Indebtedness of the Issuer is not paid when due or (as the case may be) within any originally applicable grace period;
  - (ii) any such Indebtedness becomes due and payable prior to its stated maturity by reason of default of the Issuer; or
  - (iii) the Issuer fails to pay when due any amount payable by it under any Guarantee of any Indebtedness or within any originally applicable grace period;

provided that (a) the amount of Indebtedness referred to in sub-paragraph (i) and/or sub-paragraph (ii) above and/or the amount payable under any Guarantee referred to in sub-paragraph (iii) above individually or in the aggregate exceeds  $\leq 100,000,000$  (or its equivalent in any other currency or currencies) and (b) such Indebtedness shall not include Indebtedness incurred in connection with Project Financing; or

- (d) *Security enforced:* a secured party takes possession, or a receiver, manager or other similar officer is appointed, of the whole or any part of the undertaking, assets and revenues of the Issuer; or
- (e) Insolvency, etc: if the Issuer makes any proposal for a general moratorium in relation to its debt or applies for the appointment of a conciliator (conciliateur) or enters into an amicable settlement (accord amiable) with its creditors or a judgement is issued for protection proceeding (sauvegarde) or for the judicial liquidation (liquidation judiciaire) or for a judicial transfer of the whole of the business (cession totale de l'entreprise) of the Issuer or, to the extent permitted by applicable law, if the Issuer makes any conveyance, assignment or other arrangement for the benefit of its creditors or enters into a composition with its creditors; or
- (f) *Winding up, etc:* an order is made or an effective resolution is passed for the winding up, liquidation or dissolution of the Issuer (otherwise than for the purposes of or pursuant to a Permitted Transfer); or
- (g) *Analogous event:* any event occurs which under the laws of France has an analogous effect to any of the events referred to in paragraphs (d) to (f) above,

then any Note may, by written notice addressed by the holder thereof to the Issuer and delivered to the Specified Office of the Fiscal Agent on behalf of the Issuer, be declared immediately due and payable, whereupon it shall become immediately due and payable at its Early Termination Amount together with accrued interest (if any) without further action or formality unless such default shall have been remedied prior to the receipt of such notice by the Fiscal Agent.

For the purposes of this Condition 14, "Permitted Transfer" means (a) any merger, amalgamation or group reorganisation either (i) where the surviving legal entity acquires the whole or substantially the whole of the assets of the Issuer and expressly and effectively or by law assumes all its obligations with respect to the Notes and has obtained all necessary authorisations therefor or (ii) the terms of which have been previously approved by an Extraordinary General Meeting of Noteholders.

## 15. Prescription

Claims against the Issuer for payment of principal and interest in respect of the Notes will be prescribed and become void unless made, in the case of principal, within ten years or, in the case of interest, five years after the Relevant Date.

There shall not be included in any Coupon sheet issued on exchange of a Talon any Coupon the claim for payment in respect of which would be void under Condition 12 (*Payments*).

#### 16. Replacement of Notes and Coupons

If any Note or Coupon is lost, stolen, mutilated, defaced or destroyed, it may be replaced at the Specified Office of the Fiscal Agent or, in the case of Registered Notes, the Registrar (and, if the Notes are then listed on any stock exchange which requires the appointment of an Agent in any particular place, the Paying Agent having its Specified Office in the place required by such stock exchange), subject to all applicable laws and stock exchange requirements, upon payment by the claimant of the expenses incurred in connection with such replacement and on such terms as to evidence and indemnity as the Issuer may reasonably require. Mutilated or defaced Notes or Coupons must be surrendered before replacements will be issued.

## 17. Agents

In acting under the Agency Agreement and in connection with the Notes and the Coupons, the Agents act solely as agents of the Issuer and do not assume any obligations towards or relationship of agency or trust for or with any of the Noteholders or Couponholders.

The initial Agents and their initial Specified Offices are listed below. The initial Calculation Agent (if any) is specified in the relevant Final Terms. The Issuer reserves the right at any time to vary or terminate the appointment of any Agent and to appoint a successor fiscal agent or Calculation Agent and additional or successor paying agents; *provided, however, that:* 

- (a) the Issuer shall at all times maintain a Fiscal Agent and a Registrar; and
- (b) if a Calculation Agent is specified in the relevant Final Terms, the Issuer shall at all times maintain a Calculation Agent; and
- (c) if and for so long as the Notes are listed on any stock exchange which requires the appointment of an Agent in any particular place, the Issuer shall maintain an Agent having its Specified Office in the place required by the rules of such stock exchange; and
- (d) pursuant to European Council Directive 2003/48/EC or any other Directive implementing the conclusions of the ECOFIN Council meeting of 26-27 November 2000 on the taxation of savings income, the Issuer will ensure that it maintains a Paying Agent with a specified office in an EU member state that will not be obliged to withhold or deduct tax pursuant to such Directive or any law implementing or complying with, or introduced to conform to, such Directive.

Notice of any change in any of the Agents or in their Specified Offices shall promptly be given to the Noteholders in accordance with Condition 20.

#### 18. Meetings of Noteholders; Modification and Waiver

(a) Meetings of Noteholders: The Agency Agreement contains provisions for convening meetings of Noteholders to consider matters relating to the Notes, including the modification of any provision of these Conditions. Any such modification may be made if sanctioned by an Extraordinary Resolution. Such a meeting may be convened by the Issuer and shall be convened by it upon the request in writing of Noteholders holding not less than one-tenth of the aggregate principal amount of the outstanding Notes. The quorum at any meeting convened to vote on an Extraordinary Resolution will be two or more Persons holding or representing one more than half of the aggregate principal amount of the outstanding Notes or, at any adjourned meeting, two or more Persons being or representing Noteholders whatever the principal amount of the Notes held or represented; provided, however, that Reserved Matters may only be sanctioned by an Extraordinary Resolution passed at a meeting of Noteholders at which two or more Persons holding or representing not less than three-quarters or, at any adjourned meeting, one quarter of the aggregate principal amount of the outstanding Notes form a quorum. Any Extraordinary Resolution duly passed at any such meeting shall be binding on all the Noteholders and Couponholders, whether present or not.

In addition, a resolution in writing signed by or on behalf of all Noteholders who for the time being are entitled to receive notice of a meeting of Noteholders will take effect as if it were an Extraordinary Resolution. Such a resolution in writing may be contained in one document or several documents in the same form, each signed by or on behalf of one or more Noteholders.

(b) *Modification:* The Notes and these Conditions may be amended without the consent of the Noteholders or the Couponholders to correct a manifest error. In addition, the parties to the Agency Agreement may agree to modify any provision thereof, but the Issuer shall not agree, without the consent of the Noteholders, to any such modification unless it is of a formal, minor or technical nature, it is made to correct a manifest error or it is, in the opinion of such parties, not materially prejudicial to the interests of the Noteholders. Any such modification shall be binding on the Noteholders and the Couponholders.

Notice of such modifications will be given to Noteholders in accordance with Condition 20.

#### 19. Further Issues

(a) The Issuer may from time to time, without the consent of the Noteholders or the Couponholders, create and issue further notes having the same terms and conditions as the Notes in all respects (or in all respects except for the first payment of interest) so as to form a single series with the Notes.

(b) The Issuer may also from time to time, without the consent of the Noteholders, on giving not less than 30 calendar days' prior notice to the Noteholders, consolidate Notes denominated or redenominated in euros with one or more issues of other notes ("Other Notes") issued by it and denominated in the currency of any of the member States of the European Union provided that such Other Notes are denominated in, or have been redenominated into euro and otherwise have, in respect of all periods subsequent to such consolidation, the same terms and conditions as the Notes.

In the event of any such consolidation, the Issuer may, without the consent of the Noteholders, provide for additional, and/or substitute denominations of such Notes.

Notice of any such consolidation and/or provision of additional or substitute denominations will be given to the Noteholders in accordance with Condition 20.

#### 20. Notices

#### To Holders of Bearer Notes

Notices to the Holders of Bearer Notes shall be valid if published in a daily newspaper of general circulation in London (which is expected to be the *Financial Times*) and so long as the Notes are listed and admitted to trading on any Regulated Market and the rules of such Regulated Market so require, in a leading daily newspaper with general circulation in the city where the Regulated Market on which such Notes are listed and admitted to trading is located, which in the case of Euronext Paris is expected to be *La Tribune* or *Les Echos*. If any such publication is not practicable, notice will be validly given if published in another leading daily newspaper with general circulation or, if published more than once or on different dates, on the date of the first publication as provided above.

Couponholders shall be deemed for all purposes to have notice of the contents of any notice given to the Noteholders.

#### To Registered Holders

Notices to the Registered Holders will be sent to them by first class mail (or its equivalent) or (if posted to an overseas address) by airmail at their respective addresses on the Register. Any such notice shall be deemed to have been given on the fourth day after the date of mailing. In addition, (i) so long as the Notes are listed on Euronext Paris, admitted to trading on the Regulated Market of Euronext and the rules of that Exchange so require, notices to Registered Holders will be published on the date of such mailing in a daily newspaper of general circulation in Paris (which is expected to be *La Tribune* or *Les Echos*). If any such publication is not practicable, notice shall be validly given if published in another leading daily newspaper with general circulation in Europe.

#### Notices to the Issuer

Notices to be given by any Holder shall be in writing and given by lodging the same, together with the relative Note or Notes, with the Fiscal Agent (in the case of Bearer Notes) or the Registrar (in the case of Registered Notes).

#### 21. Provision of Information

The Issuer shall, during any period in which it is not subject to and in compliance with the reporting requirements of Section 13 or 15(d) of the United States Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (the "**Exchange Act**") nor exempt from reporting pursuant to Rule 12g3-2(b) under the Exchange Act, duly provide to any Registered Holder of a Note which is a "restricted security" within the meaning of Rule 144(a)(3) under the United States Securities Act of 1933 (the "**Securities Act**") or to any prospective purchaser of such securities designated by such Holder, upon the written request of such Holder or (as the case may be) prospective Holder addressed to the Issuer and delivered to the Issuer or to the Specified Office of the Registrar, the information specified in Rule 144A(d)(4) under the Securities Act.

## 22. Rounding

For the purposes of any calculations referred to in these Conditions (unless otherwise specified in these Conditions or the relevant Final Terms), (a) all percentages resulting from such calculations will be rounded, if necessary, to the nearest one hundred-thousandth of a percentage point (with 0.000005 per cent. being rounded up to 0.00001 per cent.), (b) all United States dollar amounts used in or resulting from such calculations will be rounded to the nearest cent (with one half cent being rounded up), (c) all Japanese Yen amounts used in or

resulting from such calculations will be rounded downwards to the next lower whole Japanese Yen amount, and (d) all amounts denominated in any other currency used in or resulting from such calculations will be rounded to the nearest two decimal places in such currency, with 0.005 being rounded upwards.

## 23. Redenomination, Renominalisation and Reconventioning

- (a) *Application:* This Condition 23 (*Redenomination, Renominalisation and Reconventioning*) is applicable to the Notes only if it is specified in the relevant Final Terms as being applicable.
- (b) Notice of redenomination: If the country of the Specified Currency becomes or, announces its intention to become, a Participating Member State, the Issuer may, without the consent of the Noteholders and Couponholders, on giving at least 30 calendar days' prior notice to the Noteholders and the Paying Agents, designate a date (the "Redenomination Date"), being an Interest Payment Date under the Notes falling on or after the date on which such country becomes a Participating Member State.
- (c) *Redenomination:* Notwithstanding the other provisions of these Conditions, with effect from the Redenomination Date:
  - (i) the Notes shall be deemed to be redenominated into euro in the denomination of euro 0.01 with a principal amount for each Note equal to the principal amount of that Note in the Specified Currency, converted into euro at the rate for conversion of such currency into euro established by the Council of the European Union pursuant to the Treaty (including compliance with rules relating to rounding in accordance with European Community regulations); *provided, however, that,* if the Issuer determines, with the agreement of the Fiscal Agent that, the market practice in respect of the redenomination into euro 0.01 of internationally offered securities is different from that specified above, such provisions shall be deemed to be amended so as to comply with such market practice and the Issuer shall promptly notify the Noteholders and Couponholders, each stock exchange (if any) on which the Notes are then listed and the Paying Agents of such deemed amendments;
  - (ii) if Notes have been issued in definitive form:
    - (A) all unmatured Coupons denominated in the Specified Currency (whether or not attached to the Notes) will become void with effect from the date (the "Euro Exchange Date") on which the Issuer gives notice (the "Euro Exchange Notice") to the Noteholders that replacement Notes and Coupons denominated in euro are available for exchange (provided that such Notes and Coupons are available) and no payments will be made in respect thereof;
    - (B) the payment obligations contained in all Notes denominated in the Specified Currency will become void on the Euro Exchange Date but all other obligations of the Issuer thereunder (including the obligation to exchange such Notes in accordance with this Condition 23) shall remain in full force and effect; and
    - (C) new Notes and Coupons denominated in euro will be issued in exchange for Notes and Coupons denominated in the Specified Currency in such manner as the Fiscal Agent may specify and as shall be notified to the Noteholders in the Euro Exchange Notice; and
  - (iii) all payments in respect of the Notes (other than, unless the Redenomination Date is on or after such date as the Specified Currency ceases to be a sub-division of the euro, payments of interest in respect of periods commencing before the Redenomination Date) will be made solely in euro by credit or transfer to a euro account (or any other account to which euro may be credited or transferred) maintained by the payee with, a bank in the principal financial centre of any Member State of the European Communities.
- (d) *Interest:* Following redenomination of the Notes pursuant to this Condition 23, where Notes have been issued in definitive form, the amount of interest due in respect of the Notes will be calculated by reference to the aggregate principal amount of the Notes presented (or, as the case may be, in respect of which Coupons are presented) for payment by the relevant holder.
- (e) *Interest Determination Date:* If the Floating Rate Note Provisions are specified in the relevant Final Terms as being applicable and Screen Rate Determination is specified in the relevant Final Terms as the manner in which the Rate(s) of Interest is/are to be determined, with effect from the Redenomination Date the Interest Determination date shall be deemed to be the second TARGET2 Settlement Day before the first day of the relevant Interest Period.

## 24. Substitution

(a) *Conditions Precedent to Substitution* 

The Issuer may, without the consent of the Noteholders, be replaced and substituted by any affiliated or associated corporation of the Issuer as principal debtor (the "**Substituted Debtor**") in respect of the Notes provided that:

- (i) a deed poll in or substantially in the form schedule to the Agency Agreement and such other documents (if any) shall be executed by the Substituted Debtor as may be necessary to give full effect to the substitution (together the "Documents") and (without limiting the generality of the foregoing) pursuant to which the Substituted Debtor shall undertake in favour of each Noteholder to be bound by the Conditions of the Notes and the provisions of the Agency Agreement and the Deed of Covenant as fully as if the Substituted Debtor had been named in the Notes and the Agency Agreement and the Deed of Covenant as the principal debtor in respect of the Notes in place of the Issuer (or any previous substitute) and pursuant to which the Issuer shall irrevocably and unconditionally guarantee in favour of each Noteholder the payment of all sums payable by the Substituted Debtor as such principal debtor substantially in the form of the guarantee contained in the deed poll;
- (ii) without prejudice to the generality of paragraph (i) above, where the Substituted Debtor is incorporated, domiciled or resident for taxation purposes in a territory other than France, the Documents shall contain a covenant by the Substituted Debtor and/or such other provisions as may be necessary to ensure that each Noteholder has the benefit of a covenant in terms corresponding to the provisions of Condition 13 (*Taxation*) with the substituted Debtor is incorporated, domiciled and/or resident for taxation purposes;
- (iii) the Documents shall contain a warranty and representation by the Substituted Debtor and the Issuer (a) that the Substituted Debtor and the Issuer have obtained all necessary governmental and regulatory approvals and consents for such substituted Debtor and for the giving by the Issuer of a guarantee in respect of the obligations of the Substituted Debtor and for the performance by each of the Substituted Debtor and the Issuer of its obligations under the Documents and that all such approvals and consents are in full force and effect and (b) that the obligations assumed by each of the Substituted Debtor and the Issuer under the Documents are all legal, valid and binding in accordance with their respective terms;
- (iv) each stock exchange on which the Notes are listed shall have confirmed that following the proposed substitution of the Substituted Debtor the Notes will continue to be listed on such stock exchange;
- (v) the Substituted Debtor shall have delivered to the Fiscal Agent or procured the delivery to the Fiscal Agent of a legal opinion from a leading firm of lawyers acting for the Substituted Debtor to the effect that the documents constitute legal, valid and binding obligations of the Substituted Debtor, such opinion to be dated not more than seven days prior to the date of the substitution of the Substituted Debtor for the Issuer and to be available for inspection by Noteholders at the Specified Office of the UK Fiscal Agent;
- (vi) the Issuer shall have delivered to the Fiscal Agent or procured the delivery to the Fiscal Agent of a legal opinion from a leading firm of lawyers established in France acting for the Issuer to the effect that the Documents (including the guarantee given by the Issuer in respect of the Substituted Debtor) constitute legal, valid and binding obligations of the Issuer, such opinion to be dated not more than seven days prior to the date of substitution of the Substituted Debtor for the Issuer and to be available for inspection by Noteholders at the specified office of the Fiscal Agent;
- (vii) the Issuer shall have delivered to the Fiscal Agent or procured the delivery to the Fiscal Agent of a legal opinion from a leading firm of English lawyers to the effect that the Documents (including (provided that such guarantee is governed by English law) the guarantee given by the Issuer in respect of the Substituted Debtor) constitute legal, valid and binding obligations of the parties thereto under English law, such opinion to be dated not more than seven days prior to the date of substitution of the Substituted Debtor for the Issuer and to be available for inspection by the Noteholders at the specified office of the Fiscal Agent; and
- (viii) the Substituted Debtor shall have appointed the process agent appointed by the Issuer in Condition 25 (*Governing Law and Jurisdiction*) or another person with an office in England as its agent in

England to receive service of process on its behalf in relation to any legal action or proceedings arising out of or in connection with the Notes.

#### (b) Assumption by Substitute Debtor

Upon execution of the Documents as referred to in paragraph (i) above, the Substituted Debtor shall be deemed to be named in the Notes as principal debtor in place of the Issuer (or of any previous substitute under these provisions) and the Notes shall thereupon be deemed to be amended to give effect to the substitution. The execution of the Documents shall operate to release the Issuer as issuer (or such previous substitute as aforesaid) from all of its obligations as principal debtor in respect of the Notes.

(c) *Deposit of Documents* 

The Documents shall be deposited with and held by the Fiscal Agent for so long as any Note remains outstanding and for so long as any claim made against the Substituted Debtor or the Issuer by any Noteholder in relation to the Notes or the Documents shall not have been finally adjudicated, settled or discharged. The Substituted Debtor and the Issuer shall acknowledge in the Documents the right of every Noteholder to production of the Documents for the enforcement of any of the Notes or the Documents.

#### (d) *Notice of Substitution*

Not less than 15 calendar days after execution of the Documents, the Substituted Debtor shall give notice thereof to the Noteholders in accordance with Condition 20 (*Notices*).

In case of substitution, a supplement to this Base Prospectus will be submitted for the approval of the *Commission de Surveillance du Secteur Financier* in Luxembourg.

#### 25. Governing Law and Jurisdiction

- (a) *Governing law:* The Notes and all matters arising from or connected with the Notes, including any noncontractual obligations arising out of or in connection with them, are governed by, and shall be construed in accordance with, English law.
- (b) *Jurisdiction*: The Issuer agrees for the benefit of the Noteholders that the courts of England shall have jurisdiction to hear and determine any suit, action or proceedings, and to settle any disputes, which may arise out of or in connection with the Notes (respectively "Proceedings" and "Disputes") (including any non-contractual obligation arising out of or in connection with the Notes) and, for such purposes, irrevocably submits to the jurisdiction of such courts.
- (c) *Appropriate forum:* The Issuer irrevocably waives any objection which it might now or hereafter have to the courts of England being nominated as the forum to hear and determine any Proceedings and to settle any Disputes, and agrees not to claim that any such court is not a convenient or appropriate forum.
- (d) Process agent: The Issuer agrees that the process by which any Proceedings in England are begun may be served on it by being delivered to Thales Corporate Services Limited at 2 Dashwood Lang Road, Addlestone, near Weybridge, Surrey KT15 2NX or, if different, its registered office for the time being or at any address of the Issuer in Great Britain at which process may be served on it in accordance with Part XXIII of the Companies Act 2006. If such Person is not or ceases to be effectively appointed to accept service of process on the Issuer's behalf, the Issuer shall, on the written demand of any Noteholder addressed to the Issuer and delivered to the Issuer or to the Specified Office of the Fiscal Agent, appoint a further Person in England to accept service of process on its behalf and, failing such appointment within 15 calendar days, any Noteholder shall be entitled to appoint such a Person by written notice addressed to the Issuer and delivered to the Issuer or to the Specified Office of the Fiscal Agent. Nothing in this paragraph shall affect the right of any Noteholder to serve process in any other manner permitted by law. This Condition applies to Proceedings in England and Proceedings elsewhere.
- (e) Non-exclusivity: The submission to the jurisdiction of the courts of England shall not (and shall not be construed so as to) limit the right of any Noteholder to take Proceedings in any court of competent jurisdiction in London, Paris or New York nor shall the taking of Proceedings in any one or more jurisdictions preclude the taking of Proceedings in any other jurisdiction (whether concurrently or not) if and to the extent permitted by law.

# 26. Contracts (Rights of Third Parties) Act 1999

No person shall have any right to enforce any term or condition of the Notes under the Contracts (Rights of Third Parties) Act 1999 but this does not affect any right or remedy of a person which exists or is available apart from that Act.

# **EVENTS SINCE YEAR-END**

# **1.** Group New Organisation

As from 1 April 2013, the Group has set up a new matrix organization based on:

- Six Global Business Units (GBU) combined in three operating segments:
  - Aerospace:
    - Avionics
    - Space
    - Transport:
      - Ground Transportation Systems
  - Defence & Security:
    - Secure Communications & Information Systems
    - Land and Air Systems
    - Defence Mission Systems

- DCNS, held for 35 % by the Group

- An international organization divided between the major industrial countries (Germany, Australia & New-Zealand, Canada, the United Stated, France, the Netherlands and the United Kingdom), other European countries and emerging countries.

# 2. Main changes in scope of consolidation in 2013:

In March 2013, DCNS increased its interest in the capital of OpenHydro, an Irish start-up specialized in marine turbines, from 11 % to 62 %, for an amount of  $\in$  130.2 million ( $\in$  45.6 million at 35 %). The financial investment, net from the entity acquired treasury, amounted to  $\in$ 61.9 million ( $\in$ 21.7 million at 35 %). As from this date, OpenHydro is fully consolidated in DCNS accounts, whereas its shares were previously accounted for under the equity method. Moreover, previously-held shares were measured again at fair value at the date of the transaction for an amount of  $\in$ 6.9 million ( $\in$ 2.4 million at 35 %).

## 3. Press release dated 24 October 2013

# Order Intake

New orders in the first nine months of 2013 totalled **€8,179 million**, down **6%** at constant scope and exchange rate compared to the same period in 2012. At 30 September 2013, the consolidated **order book** amounted to **€28,872 million**, still representing around two years of sales. The book-to-bill ratio came to 0.86 in the first nine months of 2013.

Nine large **orders**, **each for an amount of over €100 million**, were booked at 30 September 2013. In Aerospace, the Group won two major contracts: one for simulation and training services for UK A400M crews and the other from the European Space Agency (ESA) as prime contractor for the 2016 and 2018 missions of the Exomars scientific programme. In Transport, two major main line rail signalling orders were signed, in South Africa and Egypt. In Defence & Security, the Group won a sensor system service support contract for the UK Royal Navy, a contract for a military communication network in France, and three contracts in the Middle East, for naval systems, air defence and critical infrastructure security. **Orders with a unit value of less than €10 million** continued to represent more than half the orders received in terms of value.

Over the first nine months of 2013, order intake in emerging markets rose by 5% organically, reaching €2,496 million and representing 31% of total order intake, vs. 27% over the same period of 2012.

New orders for the **Aerospace** segment amounted to 2,475 million, compared to 3,101 million at the end of September 2012 (-15% organically). Avionics activities were down, as the continued growth of on-board avionics activities, support and simulation activities did not fully compensated lower orders in in-flight entertainment and tubes & imaging. Space activities have seen a marked downturn in orders, especially in the Telecom segment, even though several contracts have been booked in observation and exploration satellites for institutional clients (Exomars programmes and Cosmo-Skymed). Moreover, Thales has been selected for significant space projects, in Brazil and the UAE in particular, which are not yet registered in the backlog but should be in the coming months.

In the **Transport** segment, order intake came to 955 million versus 1,137 million at 30 September 2012, which had benefited a year earlier from major orders (main line rail in Denmark and urban rail in Asia). Nonetheless, several sales successes should be noted during these first nine months, especially in emerging markets, with contracts for main line rail signalling in South Africa (Cape region) and Egypt (Cairo-Alexandria), and for urban rail in China (Hong Kong).

Order intake in **Defence & Security**, at **€4,209** million versus **€**4,210 million at the end of September 2012, represented organic growth of 3%. This evolution reflects the sharp rise in orders for Defence Mission Systems, driven in particular by the sensor system service support contract for the UK Royal Navy. By contrast, orders for Secure Communications and Information Systems were down, especially in radios, as the new tranche of the Contact software radio contract in France was only booked in October 2013. Similarly, Land & Air Systems saw

a decline in orders compared to the first nine months of 2012, despite recent successes in air defence in the Middle East and for NATO, in armaments and ammunitions in Australia and in air traffic management in the Philippines and Africa.

New orders at **DCNS** came to **€491 million** at 30 September 2013 compared to €535 million at 30 September 2012. The main orders during the period were the modernisation contract for 4 frigates and 2 patrol-supply vessels for the Royal Saudi Navy and amendments to the French FREMM frigate and submarine programmes.

#### Sales

Group sales came to  $\bigcirc,485$  million at 30 September 2013, up 6% at constant scope and exchange rates<sup>3</sup>. Sales in the Aerospace segment totalled  $\bigcirc,032$  million, up by 9% in organic terms compared to the first nine months of 2012. Avionics continued to rise sharply in the first nine months of the year, particularly flight avionics, both for original equipment and support activities, as well as in-flight entertainment and military simulation activities (A400M, FSTA). Lastly, tubes and imaging activities also made a positive contribution to sales, boosted by a significant volume of deliveries for the space industry. Sales for Space activities rose slightly, with good progress in particular of Telecom activities (Iridium, Eutelsat, Arabsat programmes). The Transport segment recorded sales of  $\bigcirc 000$  million, vs.  $\bigcirc 37$  million at 30 September 2012 (-2% organically), as recent rail signalling orders have not yet had a significant impact on sales, whereas ticketing activities enjoyed a positive evolution.

Sales in the **Defence & Security** segment came to **€4,654 million** in the first nine months of the year, up **3%** organically. In particular, sales of Defence Mission Systems saw a major advance over the period, thanks particularly to increased sales for the Rafale programme in France, the Indian Mirage 2000 upgrade and sonars. Secure Communications and Information Systems sales were globally stable in the period, with an increase of radio communication (ramp up of the Contact contract in France) and cybersecurity activities. By contrast, Land & Air Systems recorded lower sales at 30 September 2013, particularly in armaments and air defence activities. **DCNS** sales came to **€323 million** at 30 September 2013, up 19% compared to 30 September 2012. This evolution was due to the execution of programmes both in France – FREMM frigates, Barracuda submarines – and internationally.

## **Outlook for the current year<sup>4</sup>**

For the current year, Thales confirms the outlook communicated last February when the 2012 annual results were released.

Despite the continuing unfavourable economic environment in Europe, the Group continues to anticipate a slight upturn in orders and stable sales overall.

A continuing drive to improve performance should enable the Group to post a further improvement in EBIT<sup>5</sup>, which should increase by 5-8% compared to 2012.

# TAXATION

The following is a general description of certain French tax considerations relating to the Notes. It does not purport to be a complete analysis of all tax considerations relating to the Notes, whether in such country or elsewhere. Prospective purchasers of Notes should consult their own tax advisers as to which countries' tax laws could be relevant to acquiring, holding and disposing of Notes and receiving payments of interest, principal and/or other amounts under the Notes and the consequences of such actions under the tax laws of such country. This summary is based upon the law as in effect on the date of this Base Prospectus and is subject to any change in law that may take effect after such date.

# Notes issued as from 1 March 2010 other than Notes which are consolidated (assimilables for the purpose of French law) with Notes issued before 1 March 2010

Following the introduction of the French *loi de finances rectificative pour 2009 no. 3* (n° 2009-1674 dated 30 December 2009) (the "**Law**"), payments of interest and other revenues made by the Issuer with respect to Notes (other than Notes (described below) which are consolidated (*assimilables* for the purpose of French law) and form a single series with Notes issued prior to 1 March 2010 having the benefit of Article 131 *quater* of the *Code général des impôts*) will not be subject to the withholding tax set out under Article 125 A III of the *Code général des impôts* unless such payments are made outside France in a non-cooperative State or territory (*Etat ou territoire non coopératif*) within the meaning of Article 238-0 A of the *Code général des impôts* (a "**Non-Cooperative State**"). If such payments under the Notes are made in a Non-Cooperative State, a 50% withholding tax will be applicable (subject to certain exceptions and to the more favourable provisions of any applicable double tax treaty) by virtue of Article 125 A III of the *Code général des impôts*. The Finance Act for 2013 (*loi de finances pour 2013*) n°2012-1509 dated 29 December increased the 50% rate to 75% as from 1 January 2013.

Furthermore, according to Article 238 A of the French *Code general des impôts* interest and other revenues on such Notes may not be deductible from the Issuer's taxable income, if they are paid or accrued to persons established in a Non-Cooperative State or paid in such a Non-Cooperative State. Under certain conditions, any such non-deductible interest and other revenues may be recharacterised as constructive dividends pursuant to Article 109 *et seq.* of the *Code général des impôts*, in which case such non-deductible interest and other revenues may be subject to the withholding tax set out under Article 119 bis 2 of the *Code général des impôts*, at a rate of 30% or 75% subject to the more favourable provisions of the tax treaty, if applicable. The Finance Act for 2013 (*loi de finances pour 2013*) n°2012-1509 dated 29 December 2012 increased the 55% rate to 75% as from 1 January 2013.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Law provides that neither the 75% withholding tax nor the non-deductibility will apply if the Issuer can prove that the principal purpose and effect of a particular issue of such Notes were not that of allowing the payments of interest or other revenues to be made in a Non-Cooperative State (the "**Exception**"). Pursuant to the *Bulletin Officiel des Finances Publiques – Impôts* BOI-ANNX-000366-20120912 published on 12 September 2012 and the *Bulletin Officiel des Finances Publiques – Impôts* BOI-ANNX-000364-20120912 published on 12 September 2012, an issue of Notes will benefit from the Exception without the Issuer having to provide any proof of the purpose and effect of such issue of Notes, if such Notes are:

- (i) offered by means of a public offer within the meaning of Article L.411.1 of the *Code monétaire et financier* or pursuant to an equivalent offer made in a State or territory other than a Non-Cooperative State. For this purpose, an "equivalent offer" means any offer requiring the registration or submission of an offer document by or with a foreign securities market authority; or
- (ii) admitted to trading on a regulated market or on a French or foreign multilateral securities trading system provided that such market or system is not located in a Non-Cooperative State, and the operation of such market is carried out by a market operator or an investment services provider, or by such other similar foreign entity, provided further that such market operator, investment services provider or entity is not located in a Non-Cooperative State; or
- (iii) admitted, at the time of their issue, to the clearing operations of a central depositary or of a securities clearing and delivery and payments systems operator within the meaning of Article L.561-2 of the *Code monétaire et financier*, or of one or more similar foreign depositaries or operators provided that such depositary or operator is not located in a Non-Cooperative State.

# Notes which are consolidated (assimilables for the purpose of French law) with Notes issued before 1 March 2010

Payments of interest and other revenues with respect to Notes which are to be consolidated (*assimilables* for the purpose of French law) and form a single series with Notes issued (or deemed issued) outside France as provided under Article 131 *quater* of the *Direction générale des impôts* before 1 March 2010 having the benefit of Articles 131 *quater* of the *Direction générale des impôts*, will continue to be exempt from the withholding tax set out under Article 125 A III of the *Direction générale des impôts*.

In addition, interest and other revenues paid by the Issuer on Notes which are to be consolidated (*assimilables* for the purpose of French law) and form a single series with Notes issued before 1 March 2010, will not be subject to the withholding tax set out in Article 119 bis of the *Direction générale des impôts* solely on account of their being paid in a Non-Cooperative State or accrued or paid to persons established or domiciled in a Non-Cooperative State.

#### Interest received by French tax resident individuals

Pursuant to Article 9 of the 2013 French Finance Law (*loi*  $n^{\circ}2012$ -1509 du 29 décembre 2012 de finances pour 2013) subject to certain exceptions, interest received from 1 January 2013 by French tax resident individuals is subject to a 24% withholding tax, which is deductible from their personal income tax liability in respect of the year in which the payment has been made. Social contributions (CSG, CRDS and other related contributions) are also levied by way of withholding tax at an aggregate rate of 15.5% on interest paid to French tax resident individuals.

#### **EU Savings Directive**

On 3 June 2003, the EU Council of Economic and Finance Ministers adopted a new directive regarding the taxation of savings income (the "**EU Savings Directive**"). The EU Savings Directive is, in principle, applied by Member States as from 1 July 2005 and has been implemented in Luxembourg by the Laws of 21 June 2005. Under the directive, each Member State is required to provide to the tax authorities of another Member State details of payments of interest or other similar income within the meaning of the EU Savings Directive paid by a paying agent (within the meaning of the EU Savings Directive, to an individual resident or certain types of entities called "residual entities", within the meaning of the EU Savings Directive 'the "**Residual Entities**"), established in that other Member State (or certain dependent or associated territories).

For a transitional period, however, Austria and Luxembourg are permitted to apply an optional information reporting system whereby if a beneficial owner, within the meaning of the EU Savings Directive, does not comply with one of two procedures for information reporting, the relevant Member State will levy a withholding tax on payments to such beneficial owner. The withholding tax system will apply for a transitional period during which the rate of the withholding will be 20% from 1 July 2008 to 30 June 2011 and 35% as from 1 July 2011. The transitional period is to terminate at the end of the first full fiscal year following agreement by certain non-EU countries to the exchange of information relating to such payments. See "European Union Directive on the Taxation of Savings Income in the Form of Interest Payments" (Council Directive 2003/48/EC).

With effect from 1 July, 2005, a number of non-EU countries (Switzerland, Andorra, Liechtenstein, Monaco and San Marino) and certain dependent or associated territories (Jersey, Guernsey, Isle of Man, Montserrat, British Virgin Islands, Netherlands, Antilles and Aruba) have agreed to adopt similar measures either provision of information or transitional withholding) in relation to payments made by a paying agent (within the meaning of the EU Savings Directive) established within such countries or territories to, or collected by such a paying agent for, an individual resident or a Residual Entity established in a Member State. In addition, Member States have entered into reciprocal provision of information or transitional withholding arrangements with those dependent or associated territories in relation to payments made by a paying agent for, an individual resident or a Residual Entity established in a member State.

The European Commission announced on 13 November 2008 proposals to amend the EU Savings Directive. If implemented, the proposed amendments would, *inter alia*, (i) extend the scope of the EU Savings Directive to payments made through certain intermediate structures (whether or not established in an EU Member State) for the ultimate benefit of EU resident individuals, and (ii) provide for a wider definition of interest subject to the EU Savings Directive.

#### The proposed financial transactions tax

In September 2011, the EU Commission attempted to introduce an EU-wide financial transactions tax. However not all the Member States were in favour of such a tax and so the tax could not be implemented in all Member States. Subsequently, 11 Member States of the EU requested that the Commission develop a proposal for the introduction of a common financial transactions tax ("**FTT**") for each of those Member States. The Commission developed such a proposal under the EU's enhanced cooperation procedure which allows 9 or more Member

States to implement common legislation. In January 2013 the EU Council of Ministers authorised the Commission to proceed with enhanced cooperation for a common FTT and the Commission has now published a draft Directive containing proposals for the FTT. This FTT is intended to be introduced in the 11 participating Member States (Belgium, Germany, Estonia, Greece, Spain, France, Italy, Austria, Portugal, Slovenia and Slovakia). Additional Member States may decide to participate.

The proposed FTT imposes a charge on a wide range of financial transactions including purchases and sales of financial instruments including bonds; this charge will be levied at not less than 0.1% of the sale price. The FTT also imposes a charge on the conclusion of, and the purchase and sale of, a derivative contract; this charge will be levied at not less than 0.01% of the nominal amount of the derivative. Material modifications of financial instruments and derivative contracts also attract a charge at the applicable rate. In both cases the charge is applied separately to each financial institution that is party to a transaction; if a financial institution does not pay the tax then its counterparty will be jointly and severally liable.

A charge to FTT will arise if at least one party to a financial transaction is established in a participating Member State and a financial institution established in (or is treated as established in) a participating Member State is a party to the transaction, for its own account, for the account of another person, or if the financial institution is acting in the name of a party to the transaction.

In the case of the Notes, it is important to be aware that a financial institution, wherever located, will be treated as established in a participating Member State in respect of a financial transaction if it is a party (for its own account or for the account of another person) or is acting in the name of a party, to a financial transaction in respect of a financial instrument issued within a participating Member State. Given that the Issuer is incorporated in participating Member State, which is one of the 11 participating Member States, financial institutions and other persons which are party to financial transactions in respect of Notes will, to the extent not otherwise established in a participating Member State, be treated as established in participating Member State and the FTT could be payable in the relevant participating Member State if the conditions for a charge to arise are satisfied.

There are limited exemptions to the proposed FTT; one important exemption is the "primary market transactions" exemption which should cover the issuing, allotting, underwriting or subscribing for shares, bonds and securitised debt, but not derivative contracts. There is some uncertainty as to whether this exemption applies to the issuance of commercial paper or money market instruments, although the taxation of such issuances would seem likely to be in breach of EU law. There are no broad exemptions for financial intermediaries or market makers. Therefore the effective cumulative rate applicable to some dealings in financial instruments and derivatives could be greatly in excess of the headline rate of the tax.

Even though the FTT is to be introduced only in the participating Member States, it can be seen from what is said above that it could make dealings in financial instruments and derivatives more costly for persons both inside and outside the 11 participating Member States, and the FTT could be payable in relation to Notes issued under this Base Prospectus if the FTT is introduced and the conditions for a charge to arise are satisfied.

The proposed FTT is still under review and it may therefore change before it is implemented. In particular, in April 2013, the UK Government announced that is to challenge the legality of certain aspects of the proposed FTT. This challenge may lead to changes in the scope of the FTT.

It is currently proposed that the FTT should be introduced in the participating Member States on 1 January 2014. Prospective holders of the Notes are strongly advised to seek their own professional advice in relation to the FTT.

#### SUBSCRIPTION AND SALE

Notes may be sold from time to time by the Issuer to any one or more of The Royal Bank of Scotland plc, Banco Santander, S.A., Barclays Bank PLC, BNP PARIBAS, Commerzbank Aktiengesellschaft, Crédit Agricole Corporate and Investment Bank, Deutsche Bank AG, London Branch, HSBC Bank plc, Natixis and Société Générale (the "**Dealers**"). The arrangements under which Notes may from time to time be agreed to be sold by the Issuer to, and purchased by, Dealers are set out in an amended and restated dealer agreement dated 29 ctober 2013 (as amended or supplemented from time to time, the "**Dealer Agreement**") and made between the Issuer and the Dealers. Any such agreement will, *inter alia*, make provision for the form and terms and conditions of the relevant Notes, the price at which such Notes will be purchased by the Dealers and the commissions or other agreed deductibles (if any) payable or allowable by the Issuer in respect of such purchase. The Dealer Agreement makes provision for the resignation or termination of appointment of existing Dealers and for the appointment of additional or other Dealers either generally in respect of the Programme or in relation to a particular Tranche of Notes.
